I intend to say a blessing and prayer for each of you as I remove you from my social media feeds and as you come up in my memories in the future.

I take comfort that you will continue as a loving, living body of Christ. I know that you have many bright days ahead of you, and I look forward to seeing how you will continue to flourish. You will all remain in my heart, and I wish and pray that every dream comes true.



WHAT IS COOKING?

RAW APPLE CAKE

3/4 C butter

1 1/2 C white sugar

2 eggs

2 1/4 C flour

1 1/2 tsp. baking soda

1/2 tsp. salt

3/4 C cold strong coffee

1 tsp. vanilla

3 C peeled and chopped apples

Topping:

1/2 C. brown sugar 1 tsp. cinnamon 1/2 C chopped nuts



Cream butter, add sugar gradually. Add eggs one at a time (high speed), beat about 1/2 minute. Add vanilla. Shift dry ingredients "alternate with strong coffee when adding to batter (end with flour mixture). Stir in apples. Pour into a 9x13 greased/floured pan. Sprinkle sugar and nut topping mixture on top and pat down a little. Bake at 350° for about 40 minutes.

EXECUTIVE BOARD MINUTES

Executive Board Meeting Minutes Jun

June 26, 2018

Call to Order

Moderator Rich Brown called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM.

Board Members present: Kim Dible, Julie Wilkinson, Karen Holcomb-Merrill, Fay Schroeder, Rich Brown, Bil Turner, Anita Calcagno, and Bruce Ramthun. Also present: Pastor Greg Briggs.

Spiritual Reflection

Pastor Greg opened the meeting with a spiritual exercise and a prayer.

Open Forum

No one was present for this item.

Consent Agenda

The Treasurer's Report was pulled from the Consent Agenda. The Consent Agenda minus the Treasurers Report was accepted.

Treasurers Report

Fay brought to our attention that although our income exceeded our expenses in May, June will be an expensive month with several large payments coming due. There was a discussion about the size of the advertising expense, year-to-date.

Moved by Bruce, seconded by Julie to accept the Treasurers Report as submitted. Motion carried.

Discussion Items

Personnel Committee

- Anita informed the Board that interviews with four MSU candidates for Choir Director have been conducted and that none worked out. The Position Description (PD) has been revised to reflect the adjustments necessitated by a switch to a part-time minister position. The search will be broadened beyond MSU. The Executive Board will review the new PD and vote electronically, so the search can proceed.
- A nursery caregiver is still needed. After discussion, moved by Bil, seconded by Kim to ask the Personnel Committee to seek candidates to fill that position. Motion carried.

Pastor Greg remarked that the Pastor has acted as the head of the church staff in this congregation, and wondered who would perform that task in the future. Karen offered that in churches with a Bridge Pastor or Part-Time Pastor, a Personnel Committee has often acted in that capacity. Pastor Greg will speak with the Personnel Committee.

Website and Tech update

- Work is continuing on the website and it is Pastor Greg's goal to complete this work before he departs.
- Pastor Greg informed the Board of an organization/website called Tech Soup, that offers significant discounts on hardware and software.

The PC in the church office is out of date and should be replaced. The Board agreed to that replacement.

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EXECUTIVE BOARD MINUTES (continued)

Clarifying Roles and Responsibilities

• Pastor Greg has spoken with each Committee and Board regarding their role and responsibilities, with special emphasis on the Bridge Pastor time and when we have a part-time Pastor. The Outreach Board has expressed a desire for periodic contact with all future Pastors. Congregational Life and Growth is identified as the key contact group for items related to worship.

All Boards and Committees should prepare to shoulder more responsibility in the coming period, and also to become more pastoral with one another. These items should be discussed openly and often.

Maintenance Issues

- Julie has discussed the Executive Board's goals for the Maintenance Group with the four individuals in that group. There appears to be some lack of clarity on the process for initiating work and the completeness of detail for the work that is to be done. It may be appropriate for the group to come to an Executive Board meeting to clarify those issues.
- The work to repair the boiler chimney is beyond the comfort zone of the group.

New locks and keys for the Church Office and Pastor's Office was discussed and tabled.

Bridge Pastor Applications

Reverend Lovett has sent two applications for the position to Rich. Interviews need to be scheduled. The Executive Board should decide on the scope of work, the rate of pay and potential length of the agreement. The Board felt that tentatively the duties should include, preaching, funerals and pastoral care.

Items Requiring Action

Exit Interview

Pastor Greg provided the information that usually such interviews include the Executive Board and a Conference Representative. The Board felt that someone from the Personnel Committee should be invited to moderate the discussion. Bruce will help Pastor Greg plan the interview, which is scheduled for July 30, 6:30 PM.

Search Committee Update


- Karen informed the Board that she is setting up a time for training of the small group facilitators, and also for the small group sessions
- Karen, Bil and Rich will meet next week to work on the details of the Position Description/Call Agreement.

We will need reference letters from individuals who are not members or friends of our congregation. These letters will available to those candidates who express an interest in our vacant position. Individuals from the Food Bank, GLEAP, and other local churches were discussed as possibilities.
