FROM THE PASTOR'S KEYBOARD

Equipping God's People by Interim Pastor Greg Briggs

While I have been blessed to be an ordained and authorized minister in the United Church of Christ and have served in various settings including local churches, a UCC seminary, and a UCC camp and retreat center, I was not born and raised in the United Church of Christ. Instead, I joined the denomination as an adult. Before ultimately settling on the UCC, I spent some time exploring different churches and different denominations. You could say I became a shrewd church shopper. Because I was also feeling the call to ministry, I paid a lot of attention to how different denominations viewed the place and responsibility of the pastor in relationship to the rest of the church.

In the UCC, I found a wonderful expression of ordained ministry as equipping the whole church, not just the clergy, to live out God's call. Martin Luther called this the "priesthood of all believers." But I prefer how Paul talked about it in his letter to the Ephesians.

God gave some apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers. God's purpose was to equip God's people for the work of serving and building up the body of Christ until we all reach the unity of faith and knowledge of God's Son. God's goal is for us to become mature adults—to be fully grown, measured by the standard of the fullness of Christ. (Ephesians 4:11-13)

Different people are called in diverse ways, but God's ultimate purpose was to equip <u>all</u> of God's people for the work.

One of the signs of a good teacher or leader is a person that essentially is preparing their own replacement. They aren't afraid of people asking questions, or of empowering other people. That is also the sign of a good minister. The UCC's Ordained Ministers Code begins by saying,

I believe that God calls the whole Church and every member to participate in and extend the ministry of Jesus Christ; that the privilege of witnessing to the gospel in Church and society belongs to every baptized Christian; that God empowers the ministry of the Church and its members by the Holy Spirit; that the Church nurtures faith, evokes gifts, and equips its members for service; and that God calls certain of the Church's members to various forms of ministry in and on behalf of the church.

For the first promise in the code to not focus on the minister themselves, but to the whole church and every member speaks volumes about the importance of empowering every member to be God's representative on Earth. If a ministry only survives based on the efforts of one person, is that a ministry of the church?

I've been thinking about this more as the church prepares to enter a time without a settled or intentional pastor covering the full breadth of the ministries of the church. Though not everything can be anticipated or guaranteed to go smoothly, this will be a time when the church is able to see how well the members of the church, and the church overall, is equipped to serve and build up the body of Christ. It is a wonderful gift of self-awareness and spiritual growth. It is like a pop quiz, to see how well the congregation is absorbing the material. Then, when your new pastor arrives, you will have a new awareness to share with them.

With my remaining time here, I am intentionally asking the various boards and groups how I can support them as they carry on the work of the church. If you can think of some place or some task that you could use extra support, please let me know.

Greetings!!

On Wednesday night, June 13th, the Executive Board met to discuss the need to provide direction to the Search Committee as to if they should be searching for a full time pastor or a bi-vocational/part-time pastor.

The board looked closely at our financial situation and considered the comments from the congregation given during our two Crossroad Conversations.

It was pointed out that in seven of our last 10 years, we have had to utilize our savings account in order to maintain a full time pastor. In the three years that we didn't dip into our savings, it was pointed out that Pastor Nicolette had agreed to a significant salary reduction in order to balance our annual budget.

The Executive Board agreed that we should direct the search committee to seek a bi-vocational/ part-time pastor.

We recognize this will be a change in what we have become accustomed to at First Congregational UCC however it was felt this would create new opportunities for the congregation to be more involved in the life of our church while allowing us to stabilize the financial situation.

So what happens next?

A committee of the Executive Board will use the UCC Call Agreement Workbook to determine the scope of work of our next minister and whether we will call a half-time or three quarter-time pastor. This committee will make a recommendation to the Executive Board.

A couple of congregational meetings will be set up at which congregants will have facilitated discussions in small groups to talk about what we think our ministry looks like going into the future and how our next minister can walk that journey with us. These discussions will allow the Search Committee to respond to the final questions in our local church profile.

Pastor Greg will train facilitators to lead these discussions which we hope will take place in July.

OPEN & AFFIRMING (ONA) / PRIDE FESTIVAL

After Pride ... What about the other 11 months?

It's Monday morning after the weekend of Michigan Pride. It was a weekend that involved heavy lifting, miles of walking, intense heat, pouring rain, and a lot of hard work for our ONA Team. Was it worth it? You bet. Do we want to do it again next weekend? Not on your life. But today seems like a bit of a letdown, in the same way December 26th can be a letdown after a long season of preparation and celebration. So, what's next? What about the other 11 months?

Actually, we would like your help with that. Open and Affirming (ONA) is the United Church of Christ's designation for congregations, campus ministries, and other bodies in the UCC which make a public covenant of welcome into their full life and ministry to persons of all sexual orientations, gender identities, and gender expressions. But welcoming isn't enough. Education, advocacy and support are important to any organization that serves the LGBT community and their allies. Therefor, I have two questions I'd like you to consider.

The first is more open ended: What would you like to know more about when it comes to the LGBT community? Please help us to plan educational opportunities for you.

The second is a more direct question and it comes from feedback we received at pride. A number of people said they would love to visit a church like ours, but they work on Sunday mornings. This is actually part of an important issue for LGBT people. Many in the LGBT community are underemployed—college educated but working in the retail and service industries at near-minimum wage jobs. These jobs often require working on weekends. But others also have trouble making it to church on Sunday mornings because of their busy schedules: healthcare professionals, parents of children in athletic leagues, grandparents who must travel to visit their grandchildren, small business owners, people who travel for work, police/first responders, and many others. So, my second question is: *If you would be interested in having an evening midweek worship opportunity, what days of the week would be helpful to you?* Your thoughts and opinions are important to us. This is valuable information that is shared with our church leaders.

Finally, I want to thank everyone who pitched in with their time and resources to make our presence at Pride a huge success. We touched a lot of lives in small but significant ways. I would love to share some stories about our interactions with people that day, so just pull me aside some time and we'll talk.

EXECUTIVE BOARD MINUTES

May 22, 2018

Call to Order

Moderator Rich Brown called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM.

Board Members present: Kim Dible, Julie Wilkinson, Karen Merrill, Fay Schroeder, Tony Bray, Rich Brown, Bil Turner, Chris Cypher, and Bruce Ramthun. Also present: Pastor Greg Briggs, Sarah Robinson and Charlene Avery.

Spiritual Reflection

Pastor Greg opened the meeting with a prayer.

Open Forum

No one was present for this item.

Consent Agenda

The Treasurer's Report was pulled from the Consent Agenda. The Consent Agenda minus the Treasurers Report was accepted.

Treasurers Report

Fay brought to our attention that although our income exceeded our expenses by \$600 for the past month, we are about \$8700 behind for the year. She reminded us that there are some big expenses coming in the next few months.

This prompted a discussion about last month's unresolved issue of the proposed Sun Theater advertisement and the existing newspaper advertisement. After discussion it was moved by Bruce, seconded by Fay to begin the advertisement at the Sun Theater. Motion carried. Congregational Life is asked to look at the effectiveness of the existing newspaper advertisement.

Moved by Karen, seconded by Bruce to accept the Treasurers Report as submitted. Motion carried.

Discussion Items

Personnel Committee

- Regarding the Choir Director vacancy, another Skype interview with an MSU candidate has been scheduled. The Music Committee feels a commitment to finding someone for this position through MSU. They are not considering a wider search at this time.
- Performance reviews with the church staff are ongoing.

Noting that his agreement expires soon, Pastor Greg inquired about plans for an exit interview. The general feeling was that the CAM group and a few from the Executive Board would conduct that interview.

EXECUTIVE BOARD MINUTES (continued)

Search Committee

Karen informed the Board that three individuals are working on the Church Profile, and that it expected to be complete by the end of May. There will likely be some questions that will require discussion with, and input from, the congregation. She has been having conversations with Reverend Lovett regarding the interim period and the search process.

OCWM Special Offering

The offering will be held on June 3rd and Karen will speak on OCWM.

New Website

Pastor Greg reported that the website is 95% complete, with only a few details requiring some adjustments. It will be available soon for testing by the congregation.

Computer programs for Church Treasurers.

Fay explained that the Church Windows program has some significant drawbacks and she would like to look for other possible Treasurers programs.

Items Requiring Action

Expiration of Interim Call Agreement

Pastor Greg's Call agreement ends on August 1st. He confirmed that he does not want to work less than full time, and that he does not want to be a Supply Pastor. His agreement could be extended for any length. Pastor Greg pointed out that some of the options are;

- Extend the existing agreement. All other things continuing as per the budget, by the end of 2018 we would be about \$26,500 in the red.
- Bring in a Supply Pastor. By the end of 2018 we would be about \$4100 in the red.
- Hire no one and become completely self sufficient. By the end of 2018 we would be about \$2500 in the black.

We seem to be able to afford about 80% of a new pastor, or perhaps 75% of an experienced pastor.

After thoughtful discussion it was decided to not renew the existing Call Agreement. Moved by Bil, seconded by Bruce to not renew Pastor Greg's Call Agreement. Motion carried. Moved by Karen, seconded by Fay to have Rich contact Reverend Lovett to convey this decision and seek his counsel on finding a Bridge Pastor. Motion carried. Pastor Greg is asked to complete the website work and continue, where necessary, aiding with the Search process.

Rich will write an item for the Newsletter regarding the above decision and the status of the Search Process.

Meeting adjourned at 8:10 PM

The next Executive Board Meeting will be June 26th at 6:30 PM.
