

WHAT IS COOKING?

"EDIBLE" FINGER PAINT

1/2 cup rye or all-purpose flour

2 cup cold water

2 T. cornstarch

4 T. cold water

Food coloring

Mix flour and 2 cups cold water in a saucepan. Stirring constantly, bring to a simmer. Add cornstarch mixed with 4 tablespoons cold water. Allow the paint to cool, then color with small amounts of food coloring.

Crust

1/2 cup margarine

1/4 cup brown sugar

1 cup flour

1/4 cup quick oats

1/4 cup chopped nuts

Mix ingredients and spread in pizza pan. Bake at 375° for 10 minutes. Let cool completely.

Cream Mixture

1 (14 oz.) can sweetened condensed milk

1/2 cup sour cream

1 teaspoon vanilla

Mix together and set in refrigerator to chill. Spread over cooled crust. Spread any combination of fruit over the top. Cut in small squares for easy serving. Delicious and pretty. Fruit suggestions: strawberries, blueberries, kiwi, raspberries, bananas, pineapple, etc. (some fruits may need a little lemon to keep from turning brown)

MAGIC FINGER Jell-O

2 envelopes unflavored gelatin

1 (6 oz.) package Jell-O or 2 (3 oz.) packages

2 1/2 cups water

Dissolve unflavored gelatin in 1 cup cold water. Set aside. In saucepan, bring 1 cup of water to a boil and add Jell-O. Bring back to a boil and remove from heat. Add gelatin mixture. Stir and add 1/2 cup cold water. Pour into a lightly greased pan and set in the refrigerator until solid, about 2 hours. Cut into squares and store in an airtight container in the refrigerator. Can also use cookie cutters to cut into shapes.

Easter Services Update: Virginia Schiefelbein will be doing the early service on Easter Sunday and Ruth Fitzgerald will do the 10:30 Easter Service.

<u>Parking lot depression</u>: Tim McClung, who plows our parking lot, had expressed concern about the depressed area in the lot. Rich asked Julie to consult with the maintenance group to see if they would meet with Tim about this issue. The Haueter Endowment Fund and an existing Restricted Fund may be available to help with this expense.

<u>Water Bills</u>: Bil has reviewed our recent water bills and stated that our usage appears to have returned a level that was normal about one year ago. So perhaps the recent work on the kitchen pipes has had that effect.
