FROM THE PASTOR'S KEYBOARD

The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. --John 1:5

I love the season of Advent--the music, the crisp, cold air, the quiet hush that seems to fill all the world in the early morning and late evening, and the joyful anticipation of Christ's birth. For the past several years, I have added two rituals to my Advent time of waiting. Almost every evening, I bundle up with my family and go for a walk through the neighborhood to look at Christmas lights. If the weather is just way too cold, we drive. We try to turn through different side streets each evening so we can see different houses. I love the variety of what we see and hear! Some houses use a minimalist approach—just gold lights around the top of the house and porch. Others use multicolored lights, some blinking, some consistently burning. Some have music playing, while others are silent. Recently, many houses have laser light projections of various and beautiful holiday shapes. And then there are the houses with the giant inflatable Snoopies or be-hatted dogs, or (my favorite last year) Star wars paraphernalia. All are unique and beautiful.

My second ritual is to find time almost every day to sit quietly in my living room with most of the house lights off and the Christmas tree lights on. I am usually curled up under a fuzzy blanket with at least one cat in my lap (our family has four). Both of these rituals fill my soul with peace, as I take time out of my day to just be, surrounded by beauty and light. For this reason, I will be following one of Pastor Nicolette's traditions and will open the sanctuary during Advent on **Wednesday evenings from 5-7** for quiet reflection. The sanctuary will be dimmed, but our Christmas lights and candles lit.

There is something profoundly calming about seeing these lights in the darkness. Whether I am consciously thinking of Jesus or not during those times, the symbolism still works its way into my soul. At Advent, we are waiting for the promised light of Jesus to come, but seeing these various lights reminds me that he has already come. His light shines even in the darkness of these difficult times, bringing us all peace, and beauty, and love.

And so I urge you, during this Advent season, to take time to simply rest with God. Seek out spaces where there is light in darkness. Let it fill your soul with the hope and promises of love that Christ brings. Amen.



DOING OUR OWN WORK: AN ANTI-RACISM SEMINAR FOR WHITE PEOPLE

At this time in our nation, we are witnessing an alarming resurgence of white supremacy and state sanctioned violence. Now, as always, it is imperative that white people do the deep work required to claim and embody an anti-racist identity, understand the privilege they carry, develop relationships of accountability to people of color, and interrupt racism where they live, work, study, and volunteer.

Doing Our Own Work is a six-day anti-racism seminar (held over three months' time) for white people who seek to deepen their knowledge and capacity to confront racism. Doing Our Own Work helps white people move through places where they often get stuck, so that they can step up with humility, courage, and consistency to participate in movements led by people of color and help move other white people to greater anti-racist awareness and action.

If you are a white person who is ready to dive deep and come up stronger for the work of racial justice, join us!

Action and Discussion Items

Pastor's Report

Pastor Laura reported that during the last month she has performed two weddings, premarital counseling, attended meetings related to the Pine Ridge Mission trip, the 50th Anniversary service, and conducted pastoral care meetings. She also spent time familiarizing herself with our wedding policy. There was discussion of changes in her pastoral care hours and locations. Music Item.

Direct Deposit Fay has had further discussion with Eaton Federal as well as other banks. It seems that all banks will charge to add the ability to make the type of automated transfers that we need.
