FROM THE PASTOR'S KEYBOARD

Beloved Ones,

These past few Sundays, our Fresh Perspectives lessons have been themed around a journey "into the unknown"—an idea I got from watching Disney's *Frozen II*. We have been using this journey to learn new things about our world, our sanctuary, and ourselves. We started this theme to get us ready for Lent. As you know, Lent is the 40 day season before Easter where Christians take a good hard look at their lives and their communities, exploring who we are and who we wish to be. So, starting with our Ash Wednesday service, the adults will join the children on this metaphorical journey into the wilderness.

The wilderness can be a frightening place, sometimes. We might imagine it as empty, or as a desert with little water and food. We might imagine that it is unreasonably hot during the day and cold at night - that the winds blow grit in our eyes, the sun bakes our skin, and that the hot ground burns our feet. We might imagine it as being terribly lonely. Sometimes, we find ourselves in a metaphorical wilderness like this, especially if we have lost loved ones, or lost jobs, or lost our health, or made significant changes in our lives. Some of us currently feel lost in the political climate of our country, feeling that this is not the place we thought it was. Sometimes, we purposefully put ourselves in a different kind of wilderness, believing that we can find answers there or believing that we need to face inner demons. Lent is a time when we can discuss these things openly, knowing that the Christian church is a place that doesn't shy away from hard topics. Because no matter the reason we go into that wilderness - whether it is on purpose or very much by accidentjust like the Israelites who wandered in their wilderness, we will find that God does not abandon us there. Particularly at those worst moments when we feel most afraid, or most lost, or most confused, God will show up. Sometimes, God might shine as brightly as the fiery pillar that the Israelites saw. More often, God appears in the little miracles of nature. We will look around that desert and see beauty and life: small colorful plants that push their way through the parched land; colorful strata on ridges or waves of sand, making patterns in the distance; sunrises and sunsets of red and orange; a night sky entirely full of stars that we didn't even know were there. So as we journey into the unknown wilderness this Lent or even at other times in our lives, let us also look for the ways that God shows up. Amen.

This month would have almost been covered if our donations had been met. Hoping this is not a trend but also realizing that our expenses were over the budget amount also. Stepping up by making sure that all pledges and donations are made and we try very diligently to reduce our expenses will let us have another year with a positive balance.

Our hope for the future is to increase our giving and reduce our expenses so that we will be able to support a full-time pastor. With the positive outlook that this church is giving in 2019, we will soon be able to reach our goal.

Ken's Coat Closet, located at 501 S. Clinton Street, is a nonprofit clothing bank. It provides an opportunity for special education students from Eaton County to


work there to gain employment and transition skills. KCC also provides clothing and personal care items to hundreds of students and community members each year.


OGLALA LAKOTA RESERVATION



It's official! We have a trip on the calendar for Pastor Laura to lead a group (Charlene Avery, Sarah Robinson, Sandy Sipes, Charlynn and Karen Walker) to Pine Ridge for nine days in September! Pastor Laura has travelled to Pine Ridge several times, and we are looking forward to sharing the journey with her! The trip will be an intercultural immersion experience meant to teach us about Lakota culture, history, and spirituality, as well as to help us form relationships with the Lakota people. We will also be involved in hands on building and/or repair projects with some of the housing there or whatever is needed. We will come back to share our experience with you and hope to inspire another group from our church families to go to Pine Ridge in 2021! Over the next few months, our team is looking forward to reading and discussing the book Cultural Intelligence by David Livermore, having team building sessions, and also doing some major fundraising. We will be

seeking your help with that last item...fundraising! We will have a fundraising plan to share with you soon. In the meantime, we seek your prayers of love and support as we contemplate this journey!

NEWS FLASH!! Pastor Laura just discovered there are a few more openings at Pine Ridge!! If you want to go, the deadline to let her know is Sunday, March 8th. Each person will need to pay their own \$599.00 cost for the days at Pine Ridge. The fee includes the services of Re-Member, the registered 501(c)(3) non-profit organization which works to improve the quality of reservation life through relationships, shared resources and volunteer services. The fee also covers on-reservation housing, food, and transportation. A down payment of \$200.00 is required on sign-up. We plan to fund raise the remaining expenses of van rental, gasoline, hotel rooms and food enroute to Pine Ridge and back home. We leave on Friday, September 4th and return on Saturday, September 12th. Please get in touch with Pastor Laura with questions. We hope to have a couple more of you join us!

December 17, 2019

Call to Order

Moderator Rich Brown called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm.

Board Members present: Rich Brown, Charlene Avery, Fay Schroeder, Anita Calcagno, Kim Dible-Glasser, Julie Wilkinson, Bruce Ramthun, Karen Holcomb-Merrill, and Bil Turner. Pastor Laura, Virginia Schiefelbein, and Thea Oatman were also present.

Spiritual Reflection

Pastor Laura opened the meeting with a prayer

EXECUTIVE BOARD MINUTES (continued)

Pastor's Report

Pastor Laura reported that during the last month she has helped plan and conduct several special worship services with more to come, and has provided pastoral care, including planning a wedding. She also reported that this has been a very busy season for Jeanette. Pastor Laura mentioned that it appears that our Facebook page and our web page are not as well maintained as we might like, and that we need to pay more attention to our policy of not using photo images of those who have not granted permission for that use. We need someone to take on these responsibilities.

<u>Direct deposit</u> Fay reported that the process is improving.

<u>Stewardship drive</u> This year's effort is essentially complete and we remain about \$7400 short of where we hoped to be.

<u>Christian Education Proposal</u> Virginia and Thea were present to explain a proposal from the Board of Christian Education. There has been a problem finding a time for Sunday school that is acceptable to both students and teachers. The proposal is to return to holding SS during Worship Service hours and to hire a teacher. The proposal also includes purchasing a new curriculum. The proposed cost would be \$1600 per year for the teacher and \$1000 for the curriculum. After discussion, moved by Fay, seconded by Bruce to add a line item for Sunday school Teacher at \$1600 and to increase the line item for Education Supplies to \$1000. Motion passed.

<u>2020 Proposed Budget</u> Fay explained that she has received a bill for our property insurance that is about \$8100. This is an increase of \$500 over what we had budgeted for 2020. The Board agreed to increase that line item by \$500. Moved by Karen, seconded by Anita to recommend the proposed Budget to the Congregation. Motion passed. With the Education increases and this insurance increase, the budget will show a deficit of about \$10,000.

<u>Internet issues</u> Jeannette has discussed with Rich that our internet connection has had issues lately. Rich will follow up on this item.

<u>Boiler update</u> There were boiler problems (plural) last week. They are fixed for now, but we need to be alert to the possibility that the boiler will need to be replaced. Gary Burt is studying what a replacement boiler might cost. Possible methods of financing were discussed.

New Business

<u>Cosecha Michigan</u> Charlene relayed the thanks of the Cosecha Michigan Board of Directors for allowing them to use our Fellowship Hall for a recent meeting. They have inquired about the possibility of using our facilities on a regular basis, since we are centrally located in the state. After discussion, this inquiry was referred to the Outreach Board for their study and recommendation.

<u>Sign-up sheets for volunteer opportunities</u> Kim explained that sign-up sheets will soon appear for worship service volunteer opportunities. This will be similar to Time and Talent sign-up sheets in the past.

Meeting adjourned at 7:55 PM

The next Executive Board Meeting will be Tuesday, January 28th at 6:30 pm.
