CALL TO WORSHIP

One: Beloved ones, Christ has defeated death, taking away its sting!

Many: But we wonder what that means for us now, in this time of disease and uncertainty.

One: One thing that it means is that if we lose anyone to this virus or to any other injury or ailment, death is not the end. You and your loved ones are redeemed and have eternal life!

Many: But we wonder what it means for those of us who are suffering from loss, grief, loss of income, illness and fear.

One: One thing Christ's resurrection means is that God is always with you, loving you, supporting you, comforting you all the time. You can know and trust that God is with you.

Many: But we wonder what it means for those of us who are separated from our loved ones.

One: One thing it means is that nothing, nothing at all can separate you from the love of God or the love of your loved ones. Like the disciples and friends of Jesus who thought they had been separated from Jesus, you will find that Jesus is among you. Your friends and family are with you in spirit, even if they are far away.

Many: But we wonder what it means for those of us who are feeling trapped in our homes, unable to go where we want to go.

One: One thing that Christ's triumph means is that you are free. Though your face may be covered in a mask, and your bodies may be confined to a bed, or a chair, to a room or a house, to one residence or a tent, your soul is free! So, let yourself rejoice in the freedom you do have.

Many: But we wonder how? How do we do that, worried, afraid, and frustrated as we are?

One: Do what you can, one little thing at a time, and rejoice that you can do those things! And if you can dance, dance in praise to our God! If you can see, watch the dances of others with joy! If you can sing, sing in praise to our God! And if you can listen, listen with joy to the song's others sing! And if you can pray through word or just through feelings, lift up your prayers to our God!

Many: We dance and sing! We watch and listen! And we lift up our prayers to our God! Amen!

John 20:19-29

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear..., Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you!' After he said this, he showed them his hands and side. The disciples were overjoyed when they saw him. Again, Jesus said, 'Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you.' And with that he breathed on them and said, 'Receive the Holy Spirit...

Now Thomas (also known as Didymus), one of the Twelve, was not with the disciples when Jesus came. So, the other disciples told him, 'We have seen Jesus!' But he said to them, 'Unless I see the nail marks in his hands and put my finger where the nails were, and put my hand into his side, I will not believe.' A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, 'Peace be with you!' Then he said to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it into my side. Stop doubting and believe.'

Thomas said to him, 'My Lord and my God!'

Then Jesus told him, 'Because you have seen me, you have believed; blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed.'
