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## FROM THE PASTOR'S KEYBOARD

Greetings Dear Ones,

This coming Sunday is Pentecost, which is generally regarded as the beginning of the Christian church. At that time, the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples, and so many people saw this that they converted to Christianity on the spot. After this, many of them went out to others, preaching, teaching, and caring for others. They would break bread together in their homes, study scripture, and pray. They shared what they had with each other and with those in need.

The point of revisiting this story is this: In the beginning, the faithful were a Church without a building. In fact, the love and good works of the Christians spread so fast and to such a large part of the world known to them precisely because Christians practiced most of their faith out in the world. In this way, we are like the original Church. Although it pains us and we miss each other terribly, we cannot meet in our beloved church. We know that we will be together again eventually, but we can't yet know when that will be. And so, we are Being our faith wherever we are. We are practicing loving kindness at home, in the grocery stores, at Horrocks, in parks, at the gas stations. We are ordering meals for those in need or for essential workers. We are donating money to social justice organizations, to food pantries, to shelters. We are making and donating masks, and having small social distance gatherings with people who need us. And we are making calls, writing letters, and Facetiming and Zooming so that we can continue to worship God and share our love with one another. What the original church found is exactly what we are finding now: The Church IS essential, but meeting together in our building is not. God is with us all of the time, in all places, wherever we are. Thanks be to God.



The hours of operation are **Tuesdays 10:00 am to 5:00 pm and Thursdays 10:00 am to 3:00 pm.**

The food bank is located at **4980 Burt St., Grand Ledge, MI 48837**. After the phone order is placed, the procedure upon arrival is to ring the doorbell at the front door. The building is only open to volunteers at this time. Please present ID with your current address and your order will be brought to the door. Please return your cart to the porch when you are finished.

Additional information regarding food, personal care and clothing donations. Since shopping is a challenge for everyone right now, **monetary donations** would be greatly appreciated for those who are able.

The food bank **is** accepting warm weather clothing donations. If anyone is cleaning out closets during the stay home time, warm weather clothing is welcome Tuesdays 10 a.m.-5 p.m. and Thursdays 10 a.m.-3 p.m. Drop them off at the donation door (the building behind the food bank that shares the parking lot).

## STATEMENT ON FOOD INITIATIVES

Statement on Food Initiatives by the Public **Greater Lansing Food Bank** and our food partners; they understand that many groups, organizations, churches, and even families want to help their neighbors by distributing food. We have no doubt their intentions are good, however, we ask that food initiatives or food drives are not attempted at this time for the reasons below. Instead please work with the existing food pantries and agencies so your efforts don't do more harm than good. **1.** Under Gov. Whitmer's current "Stay Home, Stay Safe" Executive Order, unless the organization you're working with is already designated as an "essential food service provider," they are not allowed to do this type of work. **2.** More than ever, product safety and keeping recipients safe is our #1 priority, especially those in vulnerable populations. Most people do not have food safety knowledge and have not completed food safety training for proper sorting or packing of food. (For example, at no time should food products be placed on the floor or re-packed into individual servings outside a licensed "clean room.") Food banks and our agencies go through strict safety compliance audits and are licensed and/or properly certified to do this type of work. **3.** During this pandemic, the distribution of food by our registered food bank partners is very complex and coordinated; professionals are working together in coalitions to distribute as much food as possible to all populations without overlap to ensure food gets to as many people as possible. **4.** Food drives are not recommended at this time since all donated food from the public must be sanitized before being distributed. Currently there is not enough time for that type of work and there is no food-safe sanitization product that kills the COVID virus anyway. Additionally, the governor issued a stay-at-home order, so people shouldn't be leaving their homes to donate food. We are thankful for the caring organizations, religious groups and individuals in our community at this time. However, food safety, volunteer safety and the safety of our community is of the utmost importance so please let the professionals handle this work. **Action and Discussion Items**

Report on Pastor Laura’s condition

Karen reported that Pastor Laura does not have test results back, is feeling “somewhat ill” and is at peace with her situation. Pastor Laura has written a letter to the congregation explaining her present situation. Jeannette will distribute the letter.

Emergency Pastoral Care.

In the absence of Pastor Laura there is a continuing need for pastoral care. It would be almost exclusively phone calls and email contacts, with no hospital visits anticipated. Several names were discussed as possible candidates. Possible compensation was discussed. Rich will make the initial contacts.

Worship Coverage

Linda explained that she, Brandon and Chad Frost have been working on the upcoming worship services. There was a general discussion about those services, which will be available on the internet. Many details are complete and some still need to be worked out. There was discussion of a possible non-traditional Communion Service. Linda, Jeannette and the Frosts will continue to work on the services, the bulletins and notification to the congregation. Rich expressed thanks to all of those who have been so generous with their time in this regard.

Access to the Church

A few individuals have been in the church recently and this will continue on an as needed basis. There was discussion about checking the mailbox and wiping down door handles when you leave.

Calling Circles

Charlene explained that Pastor Laura had spoken about establishing a system of calling to check on church members and friends. The organizing of this effort has begun.

Meeting adjourned at 7:25.
