Dear Ones,

As many of you know, my family and I just returned from vacation. We traveled to the UP and did a little hiking in and around the Porcupine Mountains, swam in Lake Superior several times, visited the Copper Harbor and Houghton areas, and finally saw Pictured Rocks. We spent almost all of our time exclusively outdoors, hiking to waterfalls and resting on beaches. One of my favorite places was a waterfall in Porcupine. The main falls are reachable by a boardwalk, but once you leave that walk, you can climb a little trail to what you think are the top of the falls. But as you reach that area, you find there are more falls further up, and then more and more. It seemed to be just one little cascade after another. And the water had carved out little nooks in the land, so a tree and its roots would jut out over the river but, just on the other side of the tree, you would find little inlets or pools of water. And as we hiked, we heard song birds chirping, and would occasionally see turtles sunning themselves on a rock. It was a truly beautiful and restful place.

This vacation reminded me of the importance of rest. God called all of us to rest—fully and truly rest—one day a week. Leviticus 25 contains even more laws of rest, where the people are required to let their land rest once every seven years, and a Jubilee year every 50 years, where the people must release all servants and slaves, forgive all debts, visit their families, and basically just rest for an entire year. Can you imagine resting for a year! God calls all of these resting days and years, holy—a time dedicated to God.

And so as school starts up again and many parents and grandparents are juggling work from home, schooling from home, plus all their regular activities; as summer ends and this Covid isolation starts to wear on our hearts and souls; as the months go by and we struggle to support the civil rights of our black and brown skinned siblings; as one of the most important elections in the history of our nation nears and so many of us spend huge amounts of time reading, learning, and advocating; as our list of things that drain our energy, our bodies, and our spirits goes on and on, let us remember that resting is holy. Do not forget to rest today, and tomorrow, and the next day. Do not forget to take a day of Sabbath once a week. God yearns for time with you, and if you can make that time of rest in order to be with God, your soul will be renewed. Amen.



Spiritual Reflection

Pastor Laura opened the meeting with a reading from My Grandfather's Blessings regarding uncertainty.

Open Forum

Consent Agenda

Consent Agenda was accepted.

Action and Discussion Items

Pastor's Report

Pastor Laura reported that she has spent the majority of her time this past month planning and leading worship and making calls to members and friends. She has switched her day off to Monday.

She let the Board know that she has resigned her position at Kettering.

Pastor Laura participated in a Zoom meeting with Lt Gov. Gilchrist and Dion Williams. It was a wide ranging discussion regarding reopening churches. They urged great caution because the virus hasn't changed, and they discussed many items to consider before reopening. The general consensus seemed to be that no matter when a church reopens, we all should start actively providing more ways to worship, and more ways to support the spiritual lives of our people at home.
