Exodus 33:12-17

New Revised Standard Version

¹² Moses said to God, "See, you have said to me, 'Bring up this people'; but you have not let me know whom you will send with me. Yet you have said, 'I know you by name, and you have also found favor in my sight.' ¹³ Now if I have found favor in your sight, show me your ways, so that I may know you and find favor in your sight. Consider too that this nation is your people." ¹⁴ He said, "My presence will go with you, and I will give you rest." ¹⁵ And he said to him, "If your presence will not go, do not carry us up from here. ¹⁶ For how shall it be known that I have found favor in your sight, I and your people, unless you go with us? In this way, we shall be distinct, I and your people, from every people on the face of the earth."

¹O sing to the LORD a new song; sing to the LORD, all the earth. ²Sing to the LORD, bless Their name; tell of Their salvation from day to day. ³Declare Their glory among the nations, Their marvelous works among all the peoples. ⁴For great is the LORD, and greatly to be praised; They are to be revered above all gods. ⁵For all the gods of the peoples are idols, but the LORD made the heavens. ⁶Honor and majesty are before Them; strength and beauty are in Their sanctuary.

⁷Ascribe to God, O families of the peoples, ascribe to God glory and strength. ⁸Ascribe to God the glory due Her name; bring an offering and come into Her courts. ⁹Worship God in holy splendor; tremble before Her, all the earth.

¹⁰ Say among the nations, "God is our Ruler! The world is firmly established; it shall never be moved. She will judge the peoples with equity." ¹¹ Let the heavens be glad, and let the earth rejoice; let the sea roar, and all that fills it; *(continued)*

¹² let the field exult, and everything in it. Then shall all the trees of the forest sing for joy ¹³ before our God; for She is coming, for She is coming to judge the earth. She will judge the world with righteousness, and the peoples with his truth.

New Revised Standard Version

^{6:25} "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? ²⁶ Look at the birds of the air; they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they? ²⁷ And can any of you by worrying add a single hour to your span of life? ²⁸ And why do you worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin, ²⁹ yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these. ³⁰ But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? ³¹ Therefore do not worry, saying, 'What will we eat?' or 'What will we drink?' or 'What will we wear?' ³² For it is the Gentiles who strive for all these things; and indeed your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. ³³ But strive first for the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. ³⁴ "So do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will bring worries of its own. Today's trouble is enough for today.
