Dear Ones,


I watch a lot of Christmas movies during the Advent season. They bring me joy and teach lessons that I always appreciate. One of my favorites is *How the Grinch Stole Christmas*. As I'm sure you know, the Grinch tries to steal Christmas from the Whos in Whoville, attempting to destroy their traditions, take away their presents, and their food. But, in the end, Christmas comes anyway. It comes because it's not about presents, or decorations, or food, or even our traditions. Christmas is a celebration of Christ's birth, and the joy and thanksgiving that that celebration brings.

We can't gather in person this holiday season, and we can't hold our traditions as we normally do. Yet, we CAN still wait in anticipation for the great joy that is coming, and we can still celebrate Christmas. Our church community is going all-out to support our community in new and creative ways this Christmas and Advent and I am SO, SO grateful to you all for your willingness to embrace these new ideas. Here are a few of the activities we are supporting:

GLEAP Christmas Baskets: We are supporting 3 families facing food insecurity this season. To cut down on the possibility of Covid spread, GLEAP has asked us to mainly provide gift cards to the families. If you are interested in doing so, please send checks or gift cards to the church (checks made out to FCUCC) OR do a drive by drop-off at the church from 1-2 on Sunday, Dec. 13th.

Being a Blessing: Part of the Advent season is remembering what Christ taught us when he came to us: We are to love God with all of our hearts, minds, and strength, and we are to love our neighbors as ourselves. This year has exposed terrible inequalities within our country, one of which is racial injustice. I am proud to say that our church is showing our love for God and neighbor by working hard to try to address these injustices in our community. Please join us for the second part of our racial justice discussion with Grand Ledge United. The originally scheduled date may need to change, so please keep an eye out for emails listing the new date. It's so very important that as many people as possible show up to this. In recognition of this pain, we have a Longest Night service on Facebook Live where that pain can be given space and where we might find some healing. The date of this service is TBD, so please look for an announcement in emails.
- <u>Children's Pageant:</u> On Sunday, Dec 20th, we will air a recorded Children's Christmas Pageant during our worship service. If you, your children or grandchildren would be interested in performing in and recording a part of the play, please let me know. You do not have to be a child to participate, just young at heart!
- <u>Christmas Eve Service:</u> This year, our Christmas Eve service will be held on Facebook Live at 8pm. We plan to pre-record it to help ensure that the music all runs smoothly. If you are interested in providing music for the service, please let me know as soon as you can.

The Grinch of Covid could not steal Easter, and it will not steal Advent or Christmas. Please don't hesitate to share any other creative ways you have for celebrating this Advent and Christmas. We are a strong, loving, creative, and resilient community and we can and will get through this together.

YOU ARE INVITED! (DATE AND TIME TO BE DETERMINED) - families from First Congregational United Church of Christ will participate in a live Zoom discussion about race and racism with Grand Ledge Police Chief Tom Osterholzer, Jon Horford, founders of GL United, and Rachel Kuntzsch, now co-chair along with Jon on their Steering Committee.

GRAND LEDGE UNITED WAS FORMED SEVERAL MONTHS AGO to build a more racially diverse, inclusive, and equitable Grand Ledge in order to strengthen our community and create a welcoming environment for all. You may have a Black Lives Are Worthy sign in your yard or have seen them around the Grand Ledge community. Several signs are in our church yard too! The sign was designed and made available by GL United, with some financial support from our church, to spread their message. GL United is also working with Grand Ledge Public Schools on curriculum development to more accurately portray Black history through the past hundreds of years.

PASTOR LAURA WILL HOST THE MEETING and ask questions that you submit ahead of time. Please feel free to ask any question. The leaders of GL United have said they don't take any questions personally and that having these conversations -- even difficult conversations -- is how we all learn, grow, and heal. We will do our best to make this a safe space for that kind of conversation, which is why we are limiting it to just our church right now. Please email questions to Charlene Avery at averyc@provide.net and/or to receive the Zoom link to participate in the meeting by (NEW DEADLINE DATE WILL BE SET). You might find it useful to check out GL United's Facebook page as you formulate your questions for the meeting or to simply learn more about their current initiatives. Questions are not required to attend the Zoom meeting ... you are welcome to simply 'listen in.'

SISTERS OF RUTH

Sisters of Ruth (SOR) is working on our community service project for S.I.R.E.N. Shelter for this year. We are asking for donations of the travel size containers of personal care products to put together our Personal Care Packets for the people that must leave their homes due to an abusive person in the home. We are asking for toothpaste, toothbrushes, combs, hair brushes, deodorants, shampoos, conditioners, lotions, soaps, razors, and feminine products. We also need hand towels and washcloths. We will use products for women, children, and men. We will continue collecting these items until December 7 when we will put together the packets.

There is a box in the west entrance to the church that you may drop off your donations. They will be picked up on a regular basis.

Sister of Ruth has been doing this community service project for many years. This year it was delayed because of the COVID pandemic. When speaking with the S.I.R.E.N. Shelter, they indicated that they really need these items because of less donations and more clients.

If we need to change the date of assembling the care packets due to the Michigan Health Department's mandate, we will let everyone know in the Thursday Pause and announcements.

GLEAP CHRISTMAS BASKETS

A special little team has formed to organize our annual Outreach event to purchase Christmas food for families whose names are provided to us by GLEAP. GLEAP, the Grand Ledge Emergency Assistance Program, provides a variety of short term assistance to community families in need. Last year we had five families, but this year we have been assigned just three – a family of one and two families with two adults and two children.

Remember the dozens and dozens of staple items you brought to fill the boxes at the church in Decembers past?!! Well, no surprise that things are changing this year. Because of Covid 19 concerns, we are not collecting staple items or doing major grocery shopping. We will simply take each family a small box of fruit, Christmas card from our church families, and Meijer gift cards so they can do their own food shopping. Of course, we will wear a mask and ask the family answering the door to wear one too. If you want to join us for this project, you are warmly invited to send Meijer gift cards or a check for us to purchase gift cards. **Checks should be made out to FCUCC and mailed to the church to be received by Friday, December 11**. Or more fun...on Sunday, December 13, Pastor Laura and the Christmas basket team will be at the church, wearing masks and socially distanced, from 1-2 pm if you would like to drive by to drop off your gift card or check and received a loving wave from us! We plan to do that snow J or shine!

Now that we know our family sizes, we have set a fundraising goal of about \$600 so that our families can purchase not only groceries for Christmas Day meals but add to the food security in their pantries. We know you want to be generous in your giving. We do plan to give the GLEAP organization the gift cards and cash above that amount to help with the many requests for short term emergency assistance they will receive this winter. ..Charlene, Sandy, Sarah, and Karen W.

GRAND LEDGE FOOD BANK

Dear Friends,

I hope this note finds you all as well as possible. We continue to find ourselves in very altered times but, with patience and hope, we all will find our way to better days. The food bank continues to operate to support the needs of Grand Ledge. The community has been supportive during the long months of Covid and we thank you for your support. There is no need for food item donations at this time due to the altered function of the food bank but there are some updates to share.

Grand Ledge Meijer is once again offering their Simply Give Program. There are more than two months to participate this fall, from **October 25th, 2020 to January 2nd, 2021**. There are cards available near the check-out lanes to purchase for \$10.00. Each card purchased will be matched by Meijer and result in a \$20.00 donation to the food bank. There are two extra important dates to remember that are <u>Double Match Days</u>. Every \$10.00 card purchased on <u>Tuesday, December 1st and Saturday, December 12th</u> will result in a \$30.00 donation to the food bank. Thanks for your help spreading the word about this program. It truly is a way to stretch every dollar to help our neighbors.

The food bank is in need of a few **volunteers** to help in the food room. This involves **sorting food and packing food orders** which have been received by telephone. The recommended precautions are in place. Masks are required. There is minimum client contact. Clients ring the doorbell and the food order is brought to the door. Clients are allowed in the building by appointment only and are required to wear a mask. Please call Mary Holz, 517-627-4348, if interested.

We will once again be offering Christmas gifts to the food bank clients beginning early December. Donations of new practical gifts and toys would be appreciated.



Spiritual Reflection

Pastor Laura opened the meeting with a reading regarding the dove that Noah sent out. She offered a reflection on waiting, and how we are now waiting for many things.

Open Forum

No one was present for this item.

Consent Agenda

Consent Agenda was accepted. There was discussion about our involvement with World Vision. Godwin Muponda, the boy we have been helping, has aged out of the system, so we are no longer participating. The Outreach Board is considering other options.

Action and Discussion Items

Pastor's Report

Pastor Laura reported that in addition to her work on Worship and Pastoral care, she spent time this past month with Grand Ledge United, which meets twice a month. Additionally she worked with the music team on a variety of items, with the Banks on how to include bells, and with Christian Education.

WHAT'S COOKING?

CHRISTMAS COOKIES AND FROSING

2 cup sugar 2 eggs

1 cup buttermilk 2 tsp. baking powder

1 1/2 tsp. baking soda 1/2 tsp. salt 1 1/2 tsp. vanilla 5 - 6 cups flour

1 cup lard (can use vegetable shortening, but will not be the same)

1/2 tsp. nutmeg (optional) substitute with lemon extract

Mix, refrigerate until dough is firm to roll out. Bake 350° for about 7 minutes, don't let bottom brown if you want them to be really moist.

FROSTING

1 tsp. vanilla 1 cup vegetable shortening 1 lb. powdered sugar boiling water

Mix shortening and powdered sugar with mixer. Add vanilla and enough boiling water to thin.
