FROM THE PASTOR'S KEYBOARD

Dear Ones,

I think I speak for many of us when I say that I am SO glad 2020 is over! For so many of us, it felt like just one thing after the other kept piling on. At times, I was very much reminded of the book of Job. In that story, Job loses almost everything he could possibly lose—wealth, material goods, prestige, friends, his children, and his understanding of who God is and how God behaves. In the midst of all of that loss, a whirlwind forms and out of that whirlwind, God speaks. This is one of my favorite images in scripture—that when it seems like our lives have been turned into a tornado of terrors, we find that God is there, supporting us, and teaching us. In the end, seeing and talking to God changes Job's perspective of what happened to him and helps him embrace a new life. So I wonder what God might be saying to us out of this whirlwind of 2020? What might we learn from these experiences and how might we use them to form a new and better life?

For me, 2020 forced a decision I was already leaning toward, and that was to quit my part-time job at Kettering University. I had already been planning to do that so that I could devote more time to supporting my parents and children. But once I got Covid last spring, keeping that job was impossible and so, with Kettering's blessing, I left at the end of April. Once I recovered from Covid, this change allowed me to provide much needed care to my family, and I am very much looking forward to being able to do more of that. But this year has also forced me to spend more time alone and in quiet. Although I normally seek out and enjoy company, I found that the quiet, alone time allowed me to reflect and provided me with peace. I am hoping not to lose this when then pandemic has ended and plan to build quiet meditation time into all of my days.

Likewise, our church has made some changes in this last year. We were forced to use new technology, since we couldn't meet in person. As a result, we've reached more people with our worship services than we do when we meet in person! So although we will come together in person as soon as it's safe to do so, I would love to see us continue offering an on-line worship option during our in-person services. This is a way we can truly offer a type of radical inclusion, reaching folks who physically or mentally cannot come to the church space. This past year has also encouraged our church to expand our racial justice efforts, as the events of last summer and the election have highlighted how pernicious racism is in our community and in our country. I would like to strongly encourage us to keep up and expand this important work. Our church has so often been a voice of love, extravagant welcome and inclusion in Grand Ledge. It is truly wonderful to be a part of such an amazing church!

So as this year ends, I wonder what lessons you will take away, as an individual and as a member or friend of this church community? What changes should we keep? What new ways of being and living should we adopt? Who are we becoming, my Dear Ones, after such a difficult year? I am excited to find out!

BUILDING A MORE RACIALLY DIVERSE AND INCLUSIVE GRAND LEDGE COMMUNITY!

UPDATE AND ACTIONS REQUESTED FROM OUR DECEMBER 8 MEETING!

Pastor Laura moderated a great Zoom discussion with Grand Ledge Police Chief Tom Osterholzer, Jon Horford and Rachel Kuntzsch from Grand Ledge United the evening of December 8. Over a dozen FCUCC folks joined the conversation.

Even though I attended GL United's November community meeting, our December 8 discussion was an eye opener to me regarding some pushback against the GL United signs at the library.

Another learning experience was to hear Jon's two stories about community Black youth reacting to the yard signs. On a hot summer day, when one youth rested in a yard with a sign, the homeowner asked why he chose her yard. It was the reassurance of safety and caring the sign presented that allowed him that respite from the heat. Another youth mentored by Jon was in tears to see the signs around our community, again feeling the safety and reassurance that his life mattered.

As a follow-up to our meeting, there are two ways we can act as a church to increase awareness of racial justice issues evolving in Grand Ledge. **The first is to put a GL United sign in your yard.** If you don't already have one, I will gladly bring one if you contact me. A couple of community people have been negatively and loudly outspoken about the GL United signs at the library. **A second action would be to call or email Lise Mitchell (pronounced Lees, not Lisa), library director, to state your support of the library for its racial justice role in our community by continuing to display a GL United outside of their building.** Contact Lise at 627.7014 or director@gladl.org. If you prefer to send a written note, the address is 131 E Jefferson St, Grand Ledge, MI 48837.

Our Outreach team will be working next year to develop a plan on how we can move forward as a church to increase racial justice and diversity in our church and community. We also hope to schedule another meeting with GL United in the early months of 2021.

I have been working at the Grand Ledge Food Bank every week since March, when the pandemic began. And I have learned so much about the organization

First, that the people working there are loving, caring folks who want to help others. They are donating their time out of the goodness of their hearts. They care about feeding families just like our congregation does.

Second, and most importantly, is that all donations are greatly appreciated because that is how the Food Bank runs. And even though food donations are welcome, it's the cash donations that do the most work. The shoppers can use that money to purchase food at prices we as shoppers can't match at the grocery store.

So even though we can't do our monthly food drives right now, we can make cash donations through our annual Souper Bowl of Caring project on February 7, 2021.

Executive Board Meeting Minutes October 27, 2020

Call to Order

Moderator Rich Brown called the meeting to order at 6:32 PM.

This meeting was conducted electronically due to the Covid-19 virus distancing recommendations. Most members logged on to the Zoom website and some were connected by telephone.

Board Members present: Rich Brown, Anita Calcagno, Chris Cypher, Lynn Hart, Chris Clark, Karen Holcomb-Merrill, Charlene Avery, Pastor Laura, Fay Schroeder, Marsha Kent and Bil Turner.

Spiritual Reflection

Pastor Laura offered some positive and encouraging alternatives to all the current negativity. We have the power to advocate, to vote, to welcome those who are discriminated against. Stay in the struggle, seek justice, and do not be daunted.

Open Forum

No one was present for this item.

Consent Agenda

Consent Agenda was accepted with the following correction; Thea Oatman gave the message on October 4th, not Fay.

Action and Discussion Items

Pastor's Report

Pastor Laura reported that she worked with Jen this month to gain a clearer understanding of many of the less obvious things that Jen does for the congregation. Other items she reported on included:

- The building and grounds could use more cleaning attention than they have been receiving.
- She has attended many meetings this month, including GLAMA meetings. She will be offering the message at the Grand Ledge Community Thanksgiving service.
- It would be very helpful if, in this time of isolation from one another, cards could be sent to church families, especially those with children in the home. Showering one another with love can provide a very special and needed boost.
- A big thank you to Kim Dible, Kathy Burt and others for creating the new Church Directory. If you would like a copy mailed to your home, please contact the church office.
- Kudos to Marsha Kent and the Christian Education Board for their preparations for the Trunk or Treat event.
- Preparations have begun for both the Thanksgiving and Advent services. Pastor Laura discussed the possibility of a pre-recorded Christmas Eve Service and/or an earlier brief service in the parking lot with social distancing and masks. The Executive Board was asked to contemplate this.
- Should we have hanging of the greens on the outside of the building? There was general agreement.

Monthly Financial Update

Fay reported that at the end of September we were about \$1500 in the black for that month and about \$7600 in the black for the year. Lynn reported that receipts for October are good.

Office Manager Vacancy

Anita reported there were many applications for the vacancy, and that the Personnel Committee has narrowed the search to 6 candidates. They will further reduce that group to 2 or 3 and then have an in-person interview with those individuals. Anita will be acting as temporary Office Manager.

Worship Team Compensation

This item was discussed via email after the September meeting and the Exec Board members weighed in as part of that discussion. The proposal is:

- Increase Chuck Byam's salary to make it comparable to Judy's. Chuck's current salary is based on being solely the choir accompanist. Currently he is providing all the music support for worship.
- Give Chad a \$500 honorarium. This would be as a thank you for all the work he has put into the worship service up until now. We would need to revisit this at the end of the year to provide some form a compensation for the period going forward through December 31st. Chad had a request that the compensation not occur while he is laid off because of the impact it would have on his unemployment compensation.
- Give Troy a \$100 Meijer gift card (his store request) for his work as the liturgist each Sunday.

Motion made by Fay, seconded by Anita to approve the above three items. Motion passed.

Office Manager Compensation

This item was also discussed via email after the September meeting and the Exec Board members weighed in as part of that discussion. Moved by Anita, seconded by Karen to start the new Office manager at \$15 per hour. Motion passed.

Church Reopening Status.

It is the advice of the Barry/Eaton County Health Departments, the State of Michigan and the UCC that indoor gatherings such as church services not be conducted at this time. It was the consensus of the Exec Board that we not reopen. Rich will compose a letter to the congregation on this topic. A team is to be created to begin planning for an outside service or services when winter is over.

Finance Committee

Kim will call Leah and ask her to reactivate the Finance Committee so that they might study and create a 2021 budget proposal.

Stewardship Update

Rich reported that the Stewardship Committee will meet again this week, another mailing will go out and that Stewardship Sunday will be November 8th. A drive by pledge drop off is being planned.

New Business

Jeannette. Anita asked if anything has been discussed regarding honoring Jeannette for her 10 year service to our congregation. Apparently this has been discussed with Jeannette, and the decision was made to wait until we can gather in person. Until then, cards would certainly be appropriate.

Annual Meeting The Exec Board was asked to think about how we might conduct the next Annual Meeting.

Meeting adjourned at 7:39 PM

The next Executive Board Meeting will be Tuesday, November 24th at 6:30 PM. (Very likely a Zoom meeting)
