FROM THE PASTOR'S KEYBOARD

Dear Ones,

During Lent, we symbolically enter into the wilderness, following Jesus and his own trip to the wilderness after he was baptized. Some people give up something for Lent, recognizing the importance of self-sacrifice or believing that, through privation, we can learn something important about ourselves and our community. Others use the time for meditation and self-reflection. The thing is that it feels like we've already been in a wilderness for the past year. We all have a litary of things that have happened to us or to the world that cause us to feel this way. We've all had to give up a lot this year already and we've had ample time for self-reflection. So do we really need to observe Lent, now of all times? I think we do. There's a difference between forced isolation, forced time for self-reflection, forced sacrifice, and the willing journey into the Lenten wilderness. I don't know about you, but I went into pandemic isolation kicking and screaming, and in this winter, I am chaffing against cabin fever. But Lent is something we're invited into by the Holy Spirit. It is the still small voice of our conscience, of our curiosity, and our love for God and our world that beckons us, speaking into our souls and saying, "Come, let's take a deeper look at who you are and what you believe, if you're willing." It's a sweet and gentle invitation that bubbles up from the part of ourselves that we hold so dear—our love of God and our faith. And this makes all the difference. So even though we know that Lenten journeys are hard, we might be willing to make this one. Since it's a different kind of wilderness journey and because of where the invitation comes from, it's one that we can joyfully and thankfully accept. And so, I invite you to join us on the journey together. Whether you choose to attend our Lenten worship and book study with Trinity Episcopal Church, whether you choose to worship with us every Sunday, exploring our Lenten theme, "Who Are We, As Christians," or whether you practice your own self-sacrifice and self-reflection activities, know that this is a worthwhile and important wilderness to explore.

EXECUTIVE BOARD MINUTES

December 22, 2020

Call to Order

Moderator Rich Brown called the meeting to order at 6:32 PM.

This meeting was conducted electronically due to the Covid-19 virus distancing recommendations. Most members logged on to the Zoom website and some were connected by telephone.

Board Members present: Rich Brown, Anita Calcagno, Lynn Hart, Chris Clark, Karen Holcomb-Merrill, Charlene Avery, Pastor Laura, Kim Dible Glaser, Fay Schroeder, and Bil Turner.

Spiritual Reflection

Pastor Laura offered a prayer about Christmas week, and asked that we be helped to find peace, joy and harmony in the midst of all the stimulation.

Open Forum

No one was present for this item.

Consent Agenda

The Consent Agenda was accepted.

Action and Discussion Items

Pastor's Report

Pastor Laura reported that this month she has spent time on planning and leading the Advent and Christmas services, on Pastoral care, on the GLEAP drive-by event and on training with the new Office Assistant. She added her words of thanks to the Personnel Committee for their hard work and excellent choice on the new OA, Angela Spialek. She is also thankful for the work of all the Church Teams. She will be on vacation the week after Christmas. Sunday services will partly come from the National UCC and Michigan Conference office.

Monthly Financial Update

Fay reported that at the end of November we are \$6.4k in the black for the year, however there are some large expenses yet to be paid. Lynn reported that receipts for December are about \$10k with one Sunday remaining.

Employee Compensation

After discussion it was moved by Bil, seconded by Anita to give gift cards to Chad and Troy, \$500 and \$100, respectively. Motion passed. Cost of living raises were discussed for Pastor Laura, Brandon and Chuck. Moved by Lynn, seconded by Charlene to grant raises for those three in the amount of 3%. Motion passed.

Pastor Laura's laptop computer

The laptop computer used by Pastor Laura has gradually developed multiple problems. The best solution is to buy a new one. Moved by Karen, seconded by Charlene to authorize Pastor Laura to spend up to \$1000 on a new laptop. Lynn reported that it is very likely that Memorial Funds may be available to underwrite this expense.

2021 Budget

The proposed 2021 budget was previously sent to all Board members electronically. Lynn reported that the pledges received to date now total \$122K+ with one or two pledges outstanding. After discussion, it was moved by Bil, seconded by Lynn to increase Chuck's compensation to \$7,000. This is based on the assumption of continued remote worship services. Motion passed.

It was also agreed to add back \$420 to the Pledged Missions line item. Changes were approved earlier in this meeting that will affect some employee compensation line items. Moved by Bil, seconded by Fay to approve the Proposed 2021 Budget as previously sent and as amended this evening. Motion passed.

Annual Meeting

There was a general discussion about the best way to conduct this meeting. It seems that a Zoom meeting is the best choice. It will be necessary to have 20 members in attendance in order to conduct business. We should all make every effort to attend, to have all members in our household attend and to encourage other members to attend. It is necessary to have the Annual Meeting announced on the two Sundays preceding the Annual Meeting Sunday, which is to be held at 12:30 on January 24, 2021.

Kim announced that Leah Horn and Karen Holcomb-Merrill have agreed to be Moderator and Vice-Moderator respectively.

New Business

No new business was presented.

Meeting adjourned at 7:40 PM

The next Executive Board Meeting will be Tuesday, January 26, 2021 at 6:30 PM. (Very likely a Zoom meeting)
