# FROM THE PASTOR'S KEYBOARD

Dear Ones,

One of my favorite books is Rachel Naomi Remen's *My Grandfather's Blessings: Stories of Strength, Refuse, and Belonging*. It is a lovely book full of wisdom about how to live life to the fullest, especially in the midst of difficult situations. I have gone back to it recently, as I have been thinking a great deal about how to support you all and our community in the midst of the ongoing pandemics of Covid-19, structural racism, homophobia, heterosexism, and poverty. As I've said a few times during worship now, the trauma we, as a world, are experiencing due to Covid is affecting our bodies, emotions, minds, spirits, and relationships in multiple ways. Remen's book offers ways to rest, strengthen ourselves, and heal. It reminds us of how very important it is to bless life, to bless one another, and to find the blessings offered to us by God and one another every day, especially during times like this.

I have decided that it could be helpful to structure the six sermons I provide from Aug 1st through Rally Sunday (Sept 12<sup>th</sup>) around the six sections in her book. If you're interested, pick up a copy of the book from the library, Audible, or your local bookstore and read or listen to the section that precedes the sermon dealing with the same theme. Although I can't directly quote from the author, due to copyright restrictions, the stories she tells in those sections will hopefully combine with the scripture and sermon in some helpful ways. Here is the plan:

Aug 8: Becoming a Blessing

Aug 15: Finding Strength, Taking Refuge

Aug 22: The Web of Blessing

Sept 5: Befriending Life


Sept 12: Restoring the World (This combines with the Rally Sunday theme, "Restart")

### MEMBER AND FRIENDS SPOTLIGHT

This month's column spotlights the Gruner family, Kelly Sandula-Gruner, and David, Nate, and Declan Gruner.



#### What brought you to FCUCC?

During the pandemic/lockdown period, we had started to research more progressive, inclusive churches. We thought it might be a good time to just see what was out there. We'd imagine a lot of people went through some self-reflection during this time. The last political cycle and the alignment of many Christian churches was extremely disheartening and exhausting. We had been curious about FCUCC, as it's very near our house. We remember liking a lot of what we saw posted on your outdoor signs as we'd drive by every day!

#### What has encouraged you to stay with us or what do you like/love about this congregation?

A lot of churches claim to be welcoming but unfortunately that seems to only be a façade for many. We found your online services, started watching regularly, and were inspired that you truly meant what you said. People of all backgrounds —even people who weren't even sure what they believed spiritually—could come together and not be judged or forced into a specific set of dogma. Acceptance as is is huge...not acceptance with the expectation that you will eventually "fall into line".

#### Can you tell us a little about yourself?

We've been in Grand Ledge for 3 years now and before that, Lansing's west side (Waverly area) since 1999. Kelly did some grad work at MSU and we just ended up staying in Lansing area. Both life-long Michiganders. We were both raised Catholic and went through all the expectations growing up that came with that...First Communions, Confirmation, etc. Big Catholic wedding. It was tradition and we both have a huge amount of respect for our families, so even though we've both struggled with a lot over the years, there's a certain amount of comfort from just knowing what to expect. You can go to any Catholic church in the world and aside from language spoken, the ritual is all the same. In college and throughout our early 20s, we sought out progressive/liberal churches —well, progressive for Catholic!—on campuses. First at Central where we went to school and then at Michigan State. We got heavily involved in the music programs and still have a lot of good friends because of choir. That kept us going. We were driving from west Lansing into MSU's student parish for years; we've now been in Grand Ledge for 3 years and trying to fit in at another, more conservative church became increasingly difficult for us. It just got to the point where we really needed to find something that felt more in line with us, at this point in our lives. We want to teach our boys about how to treat people of all walks. Maybe it's middle age, but it's just gotten to the point where we can no longer say, "Well, we belong to this church, but we really don't believe this, this and this..."

#### What are some things you'd really like the church to know about you?

Just a little about us: David is a software developer (computer nerd!) working for Dewpoint in Lansing. He enjoys gaming and jazz, and plays saxophone with a couple groups. Kelly is a graphic designer —spent 17 years in corporate communications before starting her own business (Gruner Graphics) in 2019. She plays French horn with Lansing Concert Band, sings in several ensembles including Singers on the Grand based here in GL, and is active with a few community theatre groups (she has desperately missed being on stage this past year, haha!). Our boys: Nate is now 15, learning to drive, and plays percussion in the GL school band and marching drumline. He loves gaming, water skiing and awesome sports cars. Declan (aka "Dex") is 12 and will be starting band this year on euphonium. He's a total comedian, loves watching funny videos on YouTube and also a big gamer.

#### What are some things you'd really like to know about our congregation?

We've been truly inspired by what we've seen and heard so far. Looking forward to getting to know people.

# CHRISTIAN EDUCATOR POSITION

First Congregational United Church of Christ, an inclusive open and affirming church in Grand Ledge, is seeking a Christian Educator to provide Christian educational experiences for school-age children and youth, ages 5 and up.

During our current hybrid in-person/on-line worship period, this program includes a multi-age class of young people from age 5 through sixth grade (all but the first Sunday of the month). On the first Sunday, there will instead be an event for teens.

# THOUGHTS AND PRAYERS



## **EXECUTIVE BOARD MINUTES**

June 22, 2021

#### Call to Order

Moderator Leah Horn called the meeting to order at 6:31 PM.

This meeting was conducted electronically due to the Covid-19 virus distancing recommendations. Most members logged on to the Zoom website and some were connected by telephone.

Board Members present: Leah Horn, Lynn Hart, Pastor Laura, Karen Holcomb-Merrill, Charlene Avery, Lisa Reed, Fay Schroeder, Kim Dible Glasser, Chris Clark, and Bil Turner. Also present, Chuck Byam.

#### **Spiritual Reflection**

Pastor Laura offered a prayer. We come to this meeting from a variety of other efforts and cares of the day and week, but we also bring hope and excitement. Help us to remember your living breath, to breathe out the concerns and breathe in the hope.

#### **Open Forum**

Chuck Byam brought two items to the Board; equipment needs and returning to in person worship. Regarding equipment, Kraig Westfall has put together a video and a package of equipment that he recommends for us. The package could be in the \$4000 area, but there is variability depending on the quality and quantity we choose. Chuck believes that it is very important that we buy quality and that we move forward ASAP. Craig will help us set up and start up. Regarding returning to in-person worship, Chuck recommends we return soon and without masks. If masks are required, that should be reviewed on a frequent basis.

Leah commented that the Tech Team is Kelly, Thea, Charlynn and David Brunner.

#### **Consent Agenda**

Lynn commented that one giving unit has recently converted from electronic funds transfer to writing checks. With that comment, the Consent Agenda was accepted.

#### **Action and Discussion Items**

#### Pastor's Report

Pastor Laura reported that worship preparation, pastoral care and Board and Committee meetings have taken the majority of her time. She noted that our church is an integral part of the surrounding community, and we should be aware that there have been very disruptive events at the GL School Board meetings recently. We might consider individually showing our support for our School Board Members. She has been asked to be a delegate to the July 2021 Synod meetings and she will attend virtually. She will be using compassionate leave for a family member late this month. She had planned on vacation at that specific time.

#### Technology Update

As mentioned above, there is a brief video explaining what we might want as equipment to live stream our worship service. There is a pressing need to move forward with decisions in this area. If it means extra meetings, those would certainly be appropriate. The Tech Team will meet with Kraig Westfall and recommend a plan of action to the Executive Board.

# **EXECUTIVE BOARD MINUTES continued**

#### Resuming In Person Worship

Some members are anxious to resume in-person worship services, while many members can't or won't come to that type of service, and some members are not able to receive live streamed services. These factors suggest the possibility of two services. Pastor Laura has had in-depth discussions with her health care providers about how she might conduct services in the sanctuary, the risks involved for her, and she believes that with some accommodations that type of service seems possible. A lengthy discussion about many possibilities followed. The church would need to be thoroughly cleaned before inside services could resume. Leah is working on this. Moved by Bil, seconded by Chris Clark to aim for a July 11<sup>th</sup> in-person worship service, conditional on cleaning the church. Since cleaning the church is a pending issue, it was decided to vote on this motion by email, when that issue is resolved. Motion tabled.

#### Update to church use by groups

Several groups would like to resume their use of various parts of the church. The discussion on protocols included: wait until the church has been cleaned, each group should wipe down all surfaces used after their use, let all groups know that others are using the same spaces and those some may be immune-compromised and/or not masking. Moved by Fay, seconded by Charlene, that with the conditions noted above, outside groups are allowed to resume their use of church facilities. It was also moved to take down the "church closed" signs. Motion passed.

#### **New Business**

#### Pastor Laura vacation days

Pastor Laura's contract year with the Congregation ends on June 30. She is using Compassionate Leave during that last week, and hence will lose two vacation days. Moved by Karen, seconded by Charlene, that due to the extenuating circumstances of this particular situation, she be allowed to carry over those two vacation days into the next contract year. Motion passed.

#### Outreach payments.

Bil recommended that we make payments of half our budgeted amounts to OCWM and the Covenant Association. Fay agreed to make the payments.

Meeting adjourned at 8:50 PM

The next Executive Board Meeting will be Tuesday, July 27, 2021 at 6:30 PM. (Very possibly a Zoom meeting)
