Isaiah 12:2-6 NRSV (628)

Surely God is my salvation; I will trust, and will not be afraid, for God is my strength and my might; God has become my salvation.

With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation. And you will say in that day:

Give thanks to God, call on God's name; make known God's deeds among the nations; proclaim that God's name is exalted. Sing praises to God, for God has done gloriously; let this be known in all the earth. Shout aloud and sing for joy, O royal Zion, for great in your midst is the Holy One of Israel.

# NEW TESTAMENT LESSON

Luke 3:8-16 NRSV (935)

Bear fruits worthy of repentance. Do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire."

And the crowds asked him, "What then should we do?" In reply he said to them, "Whoever has two coats must share with anyone who has none; and whoever has food must do

likewise." Even tax collectors came to be baptized, and they asked him, "Teacher, what should we do?" He said to them, "Collect no more than the amount prescribed for you." 
