# FROM THE PASTOR'S KEYBOARD (CONT.)

Dear Ones,

We are in the middle of the season of Lent, a time of contemplation, repentance, and prayer. This year, our focus is on looking for, finding and using the gifts that God sets for us on our wilderness journey. You might remember that, as the Israelites wandered the desert for 40 years, they constantly encountered gifts from God that strengthened them, sustained them, and gave them hope. Some of those gifts were exactly what the people needed and prayed for—guidance, water in the desert, encouragement, God's presence. I've noticed while reading the wonderful Lenten devotionals that you wrote that several of you found the word you were asked to pray over to be that kind of welcome gift. Love, kindness, hope, rest—these are gifts that help us feel encouraged. They help us feel connected to rest of our community and to God's vision for us.

Some of the gifts the Israelites received probably were not what they had asked for—like manna. It was apparently good tasting, but it was an odd substance made of bug secretions. And after having that every day for breakfast for a few months, it must have gotten annoying. Still, it provided what the Israelites needed so that, when they reached the promised land, they could thrive. Manna makes me think of Covid masks, actually. They were a blessing when we first put them on and they still provide our community with safety and are still a blessing, but many of us are kind of sick of them. Some of you had a similar reaction to the words you were asked to pray over. Honestly, who would want to receive fortitude, perseverance, or self-control as a spiritual gift? Needing fortitude means that you're going through something rough. Needing self-control means that some part of ourselves needs to be reigned in. And yet these, too, are gifts because they do give us another aspect of what we need to get through the wilderness. My sense is that you writers who shared your thoughts about these harder words did find them to be spiritual gifts. I certainly have found something I needed in reading your devotionals.

I think that's why we have to really keep our eyes open on this Lenten journey. If it were up to me, I'd find water and God's presence everywhere on my path and forget the sticky bug secretions. But I need breakfast, just like I need fortitude, perseverance, and self-control. So it is my prayer that we all keep finding what we need in our wilderness. Amen.

First Congregational United Church of Christ – Grand Ledge Executive Board Meeting Minutes January 25, 2022

#### Call to Order

Moderator Leah Horn called the meeting to order at 6:32 p.m.

The meeting was held over Zoom due to Covid-19 distancing recommendations. One member attended by phone.

Board Members present: Charlene Avery, Chris Cypher, Kim Dible-Glasser, Lynn Hart, Karen Holcomb-Merrill, Leah Horn, Pastor Laura Miller-Purrenhage, Thea Oatman and Fay Schroeder.

Excused Members: Chris Clark, Lisa Reed and Bil Turner.

Also present were: Gary Cypher, nominee for Member-at-large, and Mary Lou Prevost, nominee for Church Clerk and substituting for Bil Turner.

#### **Spiritual Reflection**

Pastor Laura began with thanks to the Board for all of their outstanding dedication and work during the pandemic recognizing that this will be the last Board meeting for some as they fulfill their term of office. She led the group in a prayer.

# Open Forum

No one was present for this item.

# Consent Agenda

The Pastor's Report was removed from the Consent Agenda since she was on vacation prior to the meeting. The remaining items were accepted.

# Pastor's Report

- I. Thank you to this wonderful board, for all of the work you've done in this past year! It's been such a different year, switching to hybrid worship. You've done fantastic work!
- II. Time: I worked about 66 hours in 3 weeks
- III. I mainly spent on worship prep, planning, & implementation, pastoral care, upcoming confirmation class, our work with Hayes Middle school, plus administrative issues.
- IV. Special Worship prep for Epiphany, Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of prep for Lent
- V. We start our first Exploring Faith/Confirmation class tomorrow, co-taught by Karen and Demphna. Jackson and his friend Jacob are taking the class. We have been asked to offer it again in the summer for youth who can't do both the class and their schoolwork at the same time.
- VI. Sandy Sipes has done quite a bit of work with Hayes already and is taking up an offering this Sunday for them.

# **EXECUTIVE BOARD MINUTES (CONT.)**

A discussion questioning why an offering was being asked for the Hayes school project when the plan was to fund \$1,000 for this project through a \$2,000 grant through the UCC Conference, which has not yet been received. Sandy Sipes, who is working on this project, which is for the purpose of supporting teachers, staff and personal items for the 5th and

6th graders, was also able to secure an additional \$1,000 through the Grand Ledge Shopping Tour. It should be made clear where the gift cards and cash are going and how Blessings in a Backpack can help play a part in this endeavor.

#### **Action and Discussion Items**

Facilities Update

McCardel Restoration had given the church a bid for the mold remediation in the

Fellowship Hall. The church accepted the charge of \$150 for this company to provide a bid for the job, with the stipulation that this amount would go toward the cost of the payment for the job upon completion. However, they were not the company who were hired for the job. Leah contacted them about the bill two weeks ago which they said they would send. However, it has not been received to date and it is uncertain if they will send one. We are obliged to pay it in the event that it is received.

The non-working parking lot light remains a safety hazard. Leah's husband could look at this, but not until Spring. In the meantime, it was suggested that 2 large cones be purchased to mark the edge of the driveway. Leah will call to see if she can find someone to look into this and what the cost involvement would be.

The ceiling fan replacements may cost upwards of \$4,000. They are currently working on a couple of bids. One thousand dollars from the UCC Conference grant money may help pay the cost.

Stewardship Campaign One additional pledge was received. The total amount of pledges is \$119,986. This is \$3,200 less than last year.

## **Board and Committee Duties**

After the appointment of the new individuals, a meeting of the Chairs for the Boards will be held to update their responsibilities based on changes since Covid. The Covid protocol will be revisited when new members are in place.

#### **Hybrid Annual Meeting Update**

A Zoom link appears to be viable to use for the Annual Meeting. It is hopeful that the two new screens will be in place at that time. Everyone in attendance will be asked to sit near the front of the church. An e-mail will be sent out to everyone with the Zoom link.

#### **New Business**

Discussion of using Vanco Payment Solutions, Inc. for the purpose of sending contributions to church. Set-up for this would start with our Office Administrator.

Our Office Administrator, Larry, is comfortable with gas card handouts. A protocol is needed before begin-

ning this process. Bring suggestions and ideas for this protocol to be discussed at the next Board meeting.

It was determined that Fay will request Demphna Krikorian, our Christian Educator, to turn in a time sheet for hours worked. This will follow the same method for keeping track of payment to David Wee, Video Technician. Both are part-time hourly employees.

Leah thanked the Board Members for all of their hard work throughout the trauma of Covid.

Meeting adjourned at 7:25 p.m.
