FROM THE PASTOR'S KEYBOARD

Beloved Ones,

As you know, I was a delegate to Synod in July. Synod is the national conference of the United Church of Christ which had been meeting every two years (and now every three). One of the main roles of delegates at Synod is to discuss and vote on resolutions. Most of these are resolutions of witness, meaning that we, as a church, recognize an injustice or problem in our world. We name it and then resolve to do something about it. We then meet later to discuss how the national church can help local churches achieve whatever we resolved to do. This year, we passed 14 resolutions and 1 statement of witness in response to the Supreme Court Ruling against Affirmative Action. The resolutions are important and impactful. They often direct our national offices to empower our lobbyists in Washington, they open the door for national funding to be used to support the resolutions, and they give all churches in the UCC direction and resources. In some cases, they even impact the benefits plans of UCC staff and pastors.

Importantly, these resolutions are all grounded in our faith and theology. They were created, supported, and passed by the UCC because we want so strongly to do what Jesus has called us to do. That is why so many of them seem to have what we might call a political impact. As Christians, we recognize that Jesus has something to say about all aspects of our lives. He did not hesitate to make what was considered political statements in his time, speaking out against any powerful or wealthy individuals who abused their power, instructing the people to stop marginalizing others, and inviting sinners to become his followers. We also recognize that one of the main ways that we can help to make the world a better place for all of our siblings is by helping to shape public policy, by voting for people who will support all of our siblings, and by speaking publicly about our beliefs. Our voice is particularly important in this time, because the voice of extreme and conservative Christians is so very loud and, in some places, very powerful. And they are quite willing to use the political process to further their own agendas. So our voice, the voice of love, inclusion, extravagant welcome, responsibility, and hope is desperately needed right now.

I would invite you, then, to read over the resolutions and then talk to each other and to me about them. You can find the resolutions here: https://www.ucc.org/general-synod-34-highlights/. They are still in their edited form. Words with lines through them were removed, and words that are underlined were added. I would love to hear from you about them. What do you think of them? Do you have questions about any of them or do they cause you wonder about God, scripture, or what we are called to do in the world? Do they bring up any questions for you about the UCC? Do any of these resolutions particularly speak to you? Are there any that you would like to act on? If so, what might be a good first step? As we are continuing to discern our role as a bi-vocational church in this particular time and space, wondering how we fit into the larger mission of the UCC is an important question. So I wish you good reading and good wondering!

Consent Agenda

There are no Board Reports and no Pastor's Report. With those exceptions, the Consent Agenda was accepted.

Action and Discussion Items

Email Votes

• The Board voted yes on proceeding with the kitchen work, and accepting the donation that has been offered The Board voted yes on overtime pay for child care on 6/25.

Kitchen Repair/Upgrade Announcement

Leah discussed small changes that have been made to the announcement language. The announcement will be made soon.

<u>Planning/Payment for Bystander Training.</u>

The training will be on September 5th. Leah and/or Kelly will get that information out.

Our current practice includes sending Financial Secretary, Treasurer and Clerk reports to Dropbox. Perhaps Memorial Committee and Endowment Committee documents should also be stored at Dropbox.

Personnel Committee. One more member is still needed.

Lugnuts Outing. Charlene told the Board that 21 people have signed up for the event.

CPR/First Aid Training/AED Purchase. Leah explained that nine people went through the training and that during the training the church was encouraged to buy an Automated External Defibrillator. The cost is approximately \$1500. Grant funds may be available.

Lynn told the Board that Jim Hart has offered to repaint the lines on the parking lot for the cost of the paint. He will also spray the weeds in the parking lot. The cost will be about \$300. It was moved by Fay, seconded by Bil to accept this generous offer. Motion passed.
