

Dear Ones,

January is an interesting month in the life of the church. The season of Christmas ends on Jan 6th when we celebrate Epiphany—the day we celebrate when the wise ones found and worshipped Jesus. The season of Epiphany then lasts for almost two months, ending with the Sunday when we celebrate Jesus' transfiguration. So what are we doing throughout the season? What is the purpose of celebrating it? The day of Epiphany, itself, is meant to celebrate the manifestation of God among us. When we think of the word "epiphany" now, we probably think of its common usage—an "aha" moment or a sudden realization. For the wise ones, finding Jesus was not exactly an "aha" moment. They had traveled miles and miles to find him, knowing that the new star in the skies was guiding them to him. So can we really call it an "aha moment" when they found him? I would imagine it might have been more like a "well, it's about time" moment. Imagine them, traveling hundreds, if not thousands of miles. Imagine them entering the Roman empire, a state where somewhere between 1/4 and 1/3 of all its people were enslaved and poverty was rampant. Imagine them coming across Herod, but sensing that he is a cruel, tyrannical man who will do anything to keep his power. Their's was a world where it would be hard to experience hope. Yet even in the midst of that world, after all their travel, the wise ones did experience awe upon finding the Christ child. It wasn't a "well, it's about time" moment, but an actual epiphanic moment. Imagine them falling on their knees, giving their gifts, and worshipping!

I think that's the challenge before us this Epiphany season, to really look for, and allow ourselves to be surprised and awed by, the way that Jesus manifests amongst us now. We know that we will find Jesus this year, just as we have done every year. The weather is so grim in Michigan in January, the pandemic weighs heavily on us, and we have so many worries for our world. It can be hard to find actual manifestations of Jesus here, let alone be awed by him. So where is our "aha" moment?

The scripture readings throughout the season are focused on Jesus's identity, trying to help us see him working and living in our world now. So I encourage you, this month, to listen closely to the scripture lessons and think about who they are saying Jesus is. Can they help you find your "aha moment"—a time when you suddenly see the divine before you and are encouraged to fall down and worship? Let us start by entering this season as the wise ones did, with curiosity, with hope, with a heart searching for the divine.

Action and Discussion Items

Pastor's Report

Pastor Laura reported that much her time this month has been used in Worship planning and pastoral care. There have also been several meetings outside of the UCC: the Grand Ledge book club discussions and the GL Area Ministerial Assn. The external hard drive seems much more economical. The decision was made for Kelli and Larry to discuss what size hard drive to purchase, to ask Larry to purchase it and download those large files from Drop Box.

Covid Increase. Pastor Laura spoke about the recent increase in Michigan Covid cases. She asked if we want to make any changes in our approach to Worship Services. The consensus was that we do not want to make any changes now.
