# **EXECUTIVE BOARD MINUTES**

First Congregational United Church of Christ – Grand Ledge Executive Board Meeting Minutes April 26, 2022

#### Call to Order:

Moderator Leah Horn called the meeting to order at 6:34 p.m.

The meeting was held in in the Fellowship Hall with 9 members in attendance.

Board Members present were: Charlene Avery, Kelly Stuible-Clark, Gary Cypher, Lynn Hart, Karen Holcomb-Merrill, Leah Horn, Pastor Laura Miller-Purrenhage, Mary Lou Prevost and Fay Schroeder.

Excused Members: Kim Dible-Glasser and Thea Oatman

#### **Spiritual Reflection:**

Pastor Laura began with prayer.

#### **Open Forum:**

No one was present for this item.

#### **Consent Agenda:**

With the exception of the Pastor's report, all items were accepted as submitted without further discussion, including the Executive Board special meeting of April 4, 2022.

#### Item Removed from Consent Agenda and Item Discussion:

Pastor's Report:

Due to the extremely busy month, there wasn't time for Pastor Laura to prepare a detailed account of the month's activities. A brief summary includes preparing and conducting five worship services during Holy Week; and three services this past week. She officiated at Jim Johnson's funeral which was held in Marion, Michigan, near Cadillac, on April 25, 2022.

Unfortunately, the funeral home lost their internet connection and was unable to utilize the planned Zoom connection. However, it was recorded on their I-Pad which Pastor Laura will have available for our church family to view soon. There is a memorial service and luncheon to be held at our church at Noon on Monday, May 16, 2022. Additionally, there were the Wider Ministerial meetings with a vigil focused on Ukraine. There is a baptism of Baby Lucy on Saturday, April 30 which will be videoed and viewed on Sunday for the congregation.

Because of the demands during the month of April, Pastor Laura exceeded her number of contractural 20-25 working hours per week, resulting in a total of 39 hours over and above her normal schedule. In order to compensate her for this, Karen made the motion to allow her to take

comp leave from May 2 through May 8, using 24 of the 39 hours. This would leave 15 hours for which the Board would authorize additional payment to compensate her at her current rate of pay. Gary seconded this motion. Motion carried with two abstaining.

#### **Action and Discussion Items:**

#### **Facility Issues:**

Repair to Road Sign Update: The repair is underway which will run larger conduit than currently needed to allow for additional future wiring if necessary. The repair will also include relocating and replacing the timer which is not working. It was decided it was more cost effective to cut the pavement to accommodate the conduit than to risk uncertainties and cost of running it under the pavement. It is anticipated that the job will be completed by next week

for a cost of approximately \$5,000. Motion made by Lynn to pay the cost through the proceeds from the Executive Board's Endowment Fund, the UCF Haueter Endowment Fund and the Restricted Building and Property Improvement Fund. Seconded by Kelly. Motion carried.

Ceiling Fan Replacement: Since the price quote for replacing the fans was early last fall, Bil Turner has volunteered to check with the bidders to learn if their bids are still viable. Lynn Hart will contact families about the possible use of Memorial Funds for this purchase. This item is tabled until updated information is received.

Pest Control Update: An e-mail vote from the Board Members resulted in accepting the option for service every other month and prepay for a 5% discount which amounts to a cost of \$478.80 per year.

#### Bi-Vocational Pastor book Read

The book, "Bi-Vocational - Returning to the Roots of Ministry" by Mark Edington, has been pushed back to the May meeting to discuss a date to meet for discussion.

#### 4th Sunday Homilies:

It has been suggested that instead of securing someone to deliver the message for the 4th Sunday of the month, we invite people to share their statement of personal faith journey, or speak as a family, or present their story in the form of a play, etc.

Leah will prepare a draft of an invitation to the congregation to be reviewed by the Board members.

#### Purchase of Gas Cards

The draft of the Procedures for Provision of Gas Cards was reviewed with the following modifications: To the first line, add: \$300 per year to be charged to the Outreach Budget. Strike the word "wall" in the second paragraph. Motion by Karen and seconded by Charlene to accept the proposed procedures, with changes, be adopted.

Motion carried.

#### New Business:

Mentoring Program for Hayes Middle School: The school has asked if there are any individuals in our church who may be interested in serving as a mentor to the 5th-6th grade students who do not qualify for the mentor program provided to children in the younger grades. As a result of our discussion, Pastor Laura will obtain more information about the program before presenting it to the congregation.

#### **Accessible Services**

In order to make our church more welcoming to individuals with sensory issues, Kelly has offered training services to the congregation to be scheduled later this year.

Next meeting will be May 24, 2022, at 6:30 p.m. in the Fellowship Hall. Meeting adjourned at 7:50 p.m.


