#### **Grand Ledge Blessings in A Backpack**

The Grand Ledge Public Schools have over 1300 students that qualify for the federal free and reduced lunch program. To qualify for the free- and reduced-lunch program, a child must be considered "at risk for food insecurity," which means that he or she may be at risk for having inconsistent access to food at home. While these at-risk children are fed at school during the school week through the subsidized breakfast and lunch programs, what happens to these children on the weekends? Food insecurity doesn't take a break on the weekends. That's where Blessings in a Backpack Grand Ledge steps in. Our goal is to ensure that at-risk students have access to food over the weekend so that they show up at school well-nourished and ready to learn on Mondays.

Eleven years ago, Pastor Nicolette and members of our congregation played a key role in launching the Blessings in a Backpack program in the Grand Ledge community. Each year we organize a team from our church to help bag meals and prepare them for distribution. This requires about one to two hours of your your time. We are seeking six to eight members to join us on at 3:00 pm on Tuesday, June 13<sup>th</sup>, at the Sawdon Building (old high school) in Grand Ledge. This is the last distribution for the program before summer break, so let's give the kids a good start to summer!

### Call to Order

### **Spiritual Reflection**

Leah read a passage from the book of Hebrews and offered some thoughts on our mutual need for one another, followed by a prayer

### Consent Agenda

The Consent Agenda was accepted.

### Action and Discussion Items

#### Pastor's Call Agreement Discussion

Pastor Laura focused the discussion on those occasions when she has needed more than the agreed upon weekly hours. How should this situation be addressed in the future? The Board felt that her primary focus should be on what is viewed as the "core ministry". Then "core ministry" was discussed. The consensus was that only in circumstances when Pastor Laura anticipated going over her normal weekly hours <u>and also</u> the extra time was to be focused on items that were not "core ministry", she should discuss this with the Moderator or Vice Moderator and the Pastor/Parrish Team. It was agreed that this has been a rare combination in the past.

The Board is asked to think about this topic. Karen and Pastor Laura will confer about it.

#### Possible Bystander Training

Bystander Training centers on the idea that we all can play a role in creating safe public

spaces for each other when we see our neighbors and community members facing bias, discrimination, or harassment. The training is available for \$1450 for one hour and \$1600 for 1.5 hours of training. The one hour training seemed most appropriate. Kelly can look for available dates. September is likely. There may be Endowment funds available to underwrite the cost. Moved by Fay, seconded by Gary to move forward with this training. Motion passed.

#### Possible Red Cross CPR training

There is interest among staff and others to pursue this training. The cost is \$50 per trainee. There is a personnel expense line that fits this type of expense. Moved by Karen, seconded by Kelly to move forward with this training. Motion passed.



#### Funeral Costs and Procedures

After discussion it was agreed to leave all the fee amounts blank, and to fill them in as needed with the amounts that are current at the time of the funeral. So moved by Fay and seconded by Charlene. Motion passed.

#### Book Report – Part Time is Plenty

This book is written by a bi-vocational minister. Lynn reported that the book is excellent and full of inspiration and ideas that are suited for a congregation like ours. There are two copies available in the church.

Health concerns: Pray for family and friends with health concerns and those who have the Coronavirus.


