FROM THE PASTOR'S KEYBOARD

Dear Ones,

As we talk together about who we are as a church while contemplating our bivocational ministry together, a major topic continues to come up: We are an inclusive church focused on radical hospitality. For this reason, we are focusing on the concept of "One Big Table" for our Rally Sunday, on September 10 and the theme will continue in October and November so we can explore the many ways that we are One Big Family sharing One Big Table. "One Big Table" reminds us that God's table is open, welcoming, and affirming of all people. The table is both a literal reference to the sacrament of Communion and a symbol of our life together. First, we know from the many stories of scripture that Jesus invites everyone to the table, especially those who the rest of the community leaves out. Jesus goes out of his way to invite Samaritans, tax collectors (who were widely disliked at the time), the poor and needy, the sick, others regarded as impure, Gentiles...the list goes on and on. He makes it clear that God's table, the table of grace, love, and salvation is meant for every one of us. And so in our church, we stress this radical inclusivity, love, and affirmation.

On Rally Sunday, we will celebrate our One Big Table in a couple of ways: First, our worship service will be intergenerational—a service for both children and adults. Second, we will hold Communion during the service (even though it is the second Sunday of the month). Third, we will have a taco bar luncheon after the service, provided by Kamara and Ashley. They are celebrating their one-year wedding anniversary that day and asked if they could celebrate with us by providing the meal! We are very, very grateful to them!

As a part of our Rally Sunday tradition, we also would ask you all to bring a small travel

treasure to share with someone. These items should be small enough to fit inside a paper lunch bag and also very inexpensive or free. We ask that they be something you found during the summer, whether you traveled, worked at home, or worked outside of your home. Please also include a small note, explaining what the treasure is and what you were doing when you came across it. If you are worshipping with us from home, please consider dropping off your travel treasure in the blue bin outside of the church before Sept 10. Let me know that you've dropped something off, so I can make arrangements with you to get a treasure to you. Everyone there in person will get a travel treasure during the luncheon and we can share the stories with each other over the meal. We hope that you will join us on September 10 and that you will invite others to join us, too!

Community Meal

The Grand Ledge Ministerial Association wants to start having a **monthly community meal**. Rev. Ron Brooks, pastor at Grand Ledge First United Methodist Church, held the first organizational meeting on November 22. A very enthusiastic group of people from five area churches decided to have a meal at GLFUMC on the first Wednesday each month, **starting February 1**, with games and fellowship time to follow the meal. The organizing committee took a break over the busy Advent season, but now we are going full speed ahead to be ready for the first meal on February 1. We are meeting next week to talk over details and will have more answers to all our questions...and yours!

Five Grand Ledge area churches are supporting the meal: GLFUMC, Wacousta Community UMC, Delta Mills UMC, Trinity Episcopal Church, and our church. We hope to reach families living in hotels, homeless kids, low-income families, anyone who is hungry in our community and invite them to come for a simple, hot and delicious meal. Grand Ledge school counsellors are helping to identify families that we hope will come to the meal and families whose children receive food through Blessings in a Backpack. And, of course, the meal will be open to <u>anyone</u> who wants to come from our community. The attached flyer will soon be all over the community and distributed through the schools.

Meijer is donating \$250 each month, which will pay for a large portion of the food, and will have employees fill some of the volunteer slots!! The Lions Club is donating \$300 for paper products. Flour Child is donating cookies for the first meal! We have such supportive Grand Ledge community partners!!

Below is a list of monthly volunteers needed. Remember that four churches besides FCUCC have people to fill the positions.

One person willing to get ServSafe Certified for the kitchen; GLFUMC already has one person but we would like another. This training would be done through the Eaton County Health Department.

Four is the magic number needed for each of these time slots:

2-4 pm a day head – set up tables and chairs

3-5:30 pm - prep and prepare the simple meal

5:30-6 pm - serve the food

6-7:00 pm - clean-up

We know many of our church families will want to volunteer to help fill these spots. You would work perhaps every fifth month or so. Or more often if you want to. It's up to you. And perhaps some month we will try to fill all slots from our church families; otherwise, you'll have a chance to meet people from other churches and an opportunity to make a new friend!

Just as we were about to send this out, we received the SignUpGenius link for the February volunteer signup: https://www.signupgenius.com/go/10C0D45AEAC2BA6F8C43-community. Please let Charlene know if you have questions about the signup but feel free to use it. Don't be discouraged if positions are full...there will be sign up opportunities soon for the next meal or two. We will also put the signup link in Thursday Pause for future meals. She would like to keep a list of people interested in volunteering as we go through the next few months so please let her know.

Please get in touch with either one of us with your questions...and it's never too early to volunteer!

First Congregational United Church of Christ – Grand Ledge Executive Board Meeting Minutes July 25, 2023

Call to Order

Moderator Leah Horn called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM.

Spiritual Reflection

Pastor Laura led a discussion on what items the Executive Board might want to focus on in the future. The Board made suggestions that included: Bi-vocational ministry, Congregational engagement, Accessibility, Greater in person attendance, White supremacy free zone, Sabbatical preparations, Deliberate involvement of more individuals, Evaluate how we approach things, Making our progressive stances better known in the community, Stronger social media presence. The Board will discuss these possibilities.

Open Forum

No one was present for this item.

Consent Agenda

The Consent Agenda was accepted.

Action and Discussion Items

Email Votes

The Board voted yes on giving the old chairs to the Lions for disposal.

Planning & Publicity for Bystander Training.

The training will be at 6 PM on September 5th. It may be possible to attend by Zoom. Please send any Community Group and Service Group contact info to Kelly. We may allow attendance from our Sanctuary. Info should get into the Newsletter.

Possible Automated External Defibrillator (AED) Purchase.

The Grand Ledge Fire Dept has a contract with Stryker for AED supplies. Stryker is somewhat more expensive than Zole, but there are advantages to being synched to the GLFD. A device will require new batteries every five years. We have all but about \$500 committed as donations. The \$500 could come from memorial Funds. It was moved by Karen, seconded by Lynn to purchase the Stryker AED and to take \$500 from Memorial Funds. Motion passed.

Emergency Plan Updates.

The AED and its uses should be added to the Emergency Plan.

EXECUTIVE BOARD MINUTES (CONT.)

Time Off Policy for Staff

Thea and Fay have worked on this and will send out what they have. The Board had a general discussion about how to handle requests for time off without pay.

Misc. Updates

- Pastoral Sabbatical in 2024. Pastor Laura discussed with the Board that she has applied for a grant to study Women Contemplatives in Europe during her sabbatical. There would be no change of schedule. If she is successful, she may need to attend training in February. She would plan on offering classes about her studies on this topic after her sabbatical.
- Vitality Day. This event is planned for 10AM 2PM on September 30 at the St John's UCC in Owosso. It will likely be a hybrid event. Leah will arrange for publicity in the Thursday Pause and in the Newsletter.
- Parking Lot. Some work on the weeds has begun. Painting will follow, but the heat has caused a temporary pause.
- Church Roles and Ministries. This group has not reconvened yet.
- Handicapped Signs. Chris Cypher will be repainting them.
- Kitchen Repairs. Lynn let the Board know that \$6850 has been pledged and/or donated.

New Business

Family Fun Day

Kelly informed the Board that this event is scheduled for August 27th. Outdoor activities, games and snacks are planned. She will arrange for publicity with Larry.

Balls for the Basketball Hoop.

This item was discussed and it was decided to put the tub of balls outside by the back door.
