FROM THE PASTOR'S KEYBOARD

Dear Ones,

Throughout the month of October, we will be talking about Communion—it's various meanings, what it inspires us to do, and who it inspires us to be. Many Christians regard the Communion meal as central to the Christian community, since it symbolizes Christ's gift of self to us, God's grace, and God's love for us. In many ways, Communion is why I am in the UCC. You see, when I was in college, I started to consider converting to a different Christian faith in order to gain more acceptance into the family that would eventually become my in-laws. At the time, I figured that Christians basically all believed the same thing, so officially converting to one form of it shouldn't be a problem. So I attended a Palm Sunday service and was shocked to find that I was not allowed to take Communion with them. Why, I wondered, would any faith community leave me out of something so sacred? A huge argument ensued between me and my friends I had attended the service with. They claimed that Communion was a sign of *inclusion* in the community, so I would certainly be allowed to take part once I had converted. I argued that not letting me take it now meant that I was being *excluded* from that community and, in my understanding of their theology, out of God's grace. Knowing how terrible I felt at that moment, understanding the depth of alienation and loss, I decided that I couldn't convert. I didn't want to be part of excluding people like that. I wanted and needed a community that focused on *inclusion*, so I stayed in the UCC.

Once my youngest child and I were diagnosed with celiac disease, we went through a similar situation. No church that we attended provided gluten free Communion bread safely. Since even tiny amounts of wheat (like dust or crumbs) can make us dangerously sick, we couldn't join in the meal unless we were 100% sure that any gluten free Communion bread was prepared in a separate space, on separate equipment that had been fully cleaned, and with hands that had not touched regular bread (or, at least, that had been thoroughly washed with soap and water) before touching our gluten free bread. That's a lot to ask and a lot to have to check on. To avoid having to put Communion planners and servers through that incredible stress, and to avoid having to ask a thousand questions every Communion Sunday, the safest thing for everyone like us is for Communion to be entirely gluten free for everyone. Again, many churches are unwilling to make this change. They like their

small morsel of bread to taste good and they felt that gluten free bread tasted bad. In some other faiths, their theology requires that the bread contain some small amount of wheat. So we went through many Sundays, watching others take part in a meal that was supposed to connect us to one another and to God, and wishing that we could be a part of it, but excluded. I can't fully explain how painful it is to be left out of this central meal, but every time it happens, it's as if the church we are visiting is telling us that they aren't interested in being in community with people like us, and that God's grace is not for people with our medical disability. That tiny piece of bread carries a powerful symbolism.

Eventually, my home church switched to serving only gluten free bread. The joy, the thanksgiving, the connection we felt understanding that the rest of the church was willing to make that sacrifice, that they thought us important enough to make that sacrifice...I cannot explain what that felt like, except to say that we felt like we had come home.

This meal, this central meal--how we serve it, what it consists of, what we say about it, how we share it, and *that* we share it—it all matters. It sends a message about what we believe and value, about *who* we value. It sends a message about who we are as a community, who we believe God is calling us to be, and about what we believe about God's grace, love, and inclusion. That is why our church works as hard as we do to accommodate all allergies, all abilities, all needs regarding alcohol content in our Communion. We truly want to include everyone in our community, and we hope that in this small act, everyone can feel that they, too, have come home.

Spiritual Reflection

Pastor Laura facilitated a discussion on those items that had been listed last month regarding what the Executive Board might want to concentrate on in the future. The Board focused on two items from that list.

Intentional involvement of more individuals in the work of the Church. The discussion emphasized that an effort in this area should also be realistic about how many are available and willing to participate and our recent history at recruiting help.

Making ourselves better known in the community. The discussion touched on several ideas; internet identity, sponsoring events such as date night child care, family events in the Fellowship Hall, after school child care, and others. A claim has been initiated with our insurance company.
